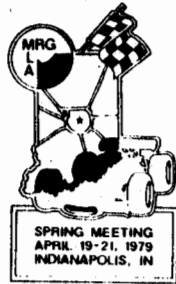

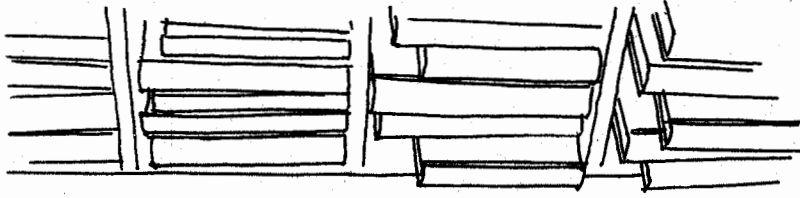

AUTHORS AND BOOKS

It's always instructive, sometimes surprising and more often than not fascinating to discover how writers of varying types of literature approach their work, how they decide to go in a certain direction, and once embarked, how they focus in on their subject and bring it to a satisfactory conclusion.

In AUTHORS AND BOOKS, a four-session program of writers on writing (Tuesdays, 6-7:20 p.m.), you will learn about the creative process by talking with successful writers about the art of both fiction and nonfiction writing.

Feb. 20—Writing for Young Adults. This program will look at authors' individual, true-to-life treatment of tough topics important to today's youth through both fiction and nonfiction. *Marian Dane Bauer*, author of **SHELTER FROM THE WIND**, and *Joyce Slayton Mitchell*, author of many factual books on the decisions young people face growing up today (**BE A MOTHER AND MORE**), will be guest authors.

Mar. 6—Wisconsin Women Biographers. Their subjects are women too. *Margot Peters*, *UW-Whitewater*, author of a biography of *Charlotte Bronte (UNQUIET SOUL)*, and *Susan Friedman*, *UW-Madison*, whose subject is a distinguished poet of the twenties, *HD (Hilda Doolittle)*, will discuss biographical writing as practiced from the wider perspective of the women's movement—new insights into the critical treatment of those two writers in their own times and how their lives shaped the content of their writing.

Mar. 20—Science Fiction. Two midwestern science fiction authors will introduce you to their exacting craft. *Wisconsin-born Clifford Simak*, long-established in the science fiction field, and *Gene DeWeese*, more recently established, will talk about their work and be ready to answer questions.

Apr. 3—Prairie Gleanings. From a brand new anthology of that name, *Wisconsin authors* will give you samples of their work and describe their creative experiences begun in a writing group of older people at the *Colonial Club in Sun Prairie*—how they sharpened their skills and brought off this exciting venture.
