October 18,19 WHSLA Annual Meeting in Oshkosh

WHSLA EXECUTIVE BOARD CONDENSED MINUTES

The Executive Board of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Association (WHSLA) met in Madison on May 4, 1979. Reports from the following Committees were presented:

Education - members have made recommendations regarding topics for WHSLA programs and CE courses and content for the 1979/80 ETN Library Seminars.

Membership - members are preparing a letter of invitation for recruitment purposes; a directory of officers, committees and consortia; and a mailing list. The Committee will also investigate the cost and feasibility of an advertising brochure for WHSLA and a membership card for paid members.

Publications - members are investigating the editorship and funding needs of a WHSLA Newsletter and alternative ways to gather content for it.

Program - members are working on the 1979 Annual meeting of the WHSLA to be held at the Pioneer Inn in Oshkosh on October 18,19.

Legislation - members have written four articles for the Wisconsin Health Science Library Association Newsletter and will continue to keep WHSLA members up-to-date on laws which affect health science libraries.

Bylaws - members are preparing recommendations for Bylaws changes to be presented at the annual meeting.

Under new business, the executive Board agreed that Organizational Guidelines should be written for WHSLA following the final report of the Bylaws Committee. The current balance in the WHSLA treasury is \$1442.57 and thirty-three new members have joined WHSLA since September 1978. Before adjournment, the Executive Committee briefly discussed the decision-making and advisory structures of MHSLN and how basic unit libraries can participate in regional programs.

NEW EPIDEMIOLOGIC DATA BASE AVAILABLE

Computerized descriptions of current epidemiologic research projects supported by Government and private funds will become available for public use starting May 1979. The on-line file is sponsored by the Epidemiology Work Group of the Interagency Regulatory Liaison Group which is comprised of five United States Government Agencies -- the Consumer Product Safety Commission, Environmental

Protection Agency, Food and Drug Administration, Food Safety and Quality Service, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration. The project entries are selected from the files of the Smithsonian Science Information Exchange.

The file, a part of TOXLINE and accessible under the National Library of Medicine's MEDLARS service, will be updated monthly and will eventually contain information on an estimated 3,000 studies covering:

- morbidity and mortality
- occupational, consumer and other population exposure to various hazards
- biologic (including genetic), pharmacologic, and environmental research on susceptibility to disease
- infectious and other diseases related to chemical exposure.

Government Agencies will use the information to reduce duplication of research, assess benefits of rulemaking, fill gaps in knowledge, and facilitate communication. The file will also be useful for non-Governmental administrators and researchers concerned with the health or safety of foods, drugs, cosmetics and other consumer products; workers; and the environment.

The entry for each research project will include an abstract and name of the principal investigators, supporting agency, researching organization with its address, and funding level. Indexes of subject area, investigators, organizations and master grant numbers will also be provided.

Subscribers will also have access to the professional literature of epidemiology and other health sciences through MEDLARS computerized retrieval services. Prospective users not currently MEDLARS subscribers should contact their local Regional Medical Library for application to the system and a 5-day user's training course.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The Assembly State Affairs Committee, on March 20, conducted a public hearing on Assembly Bill 20, the library services bill introduced by the Legislative Council which would create a Board on Library and Network Development, improve the

state aid formula for public library systems, redefine Reference and Loan Library objectives, and strengthen statement of state-level library functions.

Presentations made by Rep. Calvin Potter, Chairman of the Special Committee on Library Laws, whose majority views were reflected in AB20, and by State Superintendent Barbara Thompson for the Department of Public Instruction, exemplified the pattern of librarians, library board members, and government officials who testified after them -- near unanimous agreement on all points except the proposal to create a Board with policy-making, rule-making and quasi-judicial powers.

In addition to Rep. Potter, Wayne Bassett, Bernard Schwab and Henry Bates testified in favor of the Board concept. Charles Bunge, representing the Board of Directors of the Wisconsin Library Association, explained the compromise proposal adopted by that Board, calling for a strengthened mixed Council on Library and Network Development. Several school media representatives of public libraries and library systems, supported the WLA Board position.

On May 8, the State Affairs Committee met again and AB20 was passed by a vote of 7-6 as amended by 90th District representative Sharon Metz. The bill will probably be referred to the Joint Finance Committee and then the Assembly.

The bill deletes an Advisory Council on Library and Network Development and calls for a mixed policy-making Board to be appointed by the Governor with members serving for staggered six-year terms. The Board is to be composed of nine lay members from each of Wisconsin's congressional districts and seven professional members. Lay Board members are to be selected to represent interests of persons served by different types of libraries and library networks. Professional members of the Board are to be selected to represent various types of libraries. As in the original AB20, the proposed Board on Library and Network Development has policy-making authority over state library activities, except school library media services which remain with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Under the bill, the Board is attached to the Department of Public Instruction for administrative purposes. The Division for Library Services is assigned duties in the areas of the Board's authority as well as duties relating to school media services. All of the Division's duties are to be carried out under the supervision of the State Superintendent but duties in the area of the Board's authority are to be carried out pursuant to policy rules and standards established by the Board.

A second amendment, (the Shoemaker-Byers amendment) proposing in the Department of Public Instruction an Advisory Council on Library and Network Development, was not introduced at the May 8th meeting. The Shoemaker-Byers amendment

was based on the compromise amendment recommended by the WLA Board of Directors. The mixed Council of the Shoemaker-Byers amendment would have advised the State Superintendent on policies relating to all state level library services without separating school media services from other types of library services.

Both versions of the bill include a recommendation for studies on aids to medical libraries and system resource libraries, funding for state level resource providers, and organization of and funding for areawide interlibrary cooperation and resource sharing.

WISCONSIN ASSOCIATION ON ALCOHOLISM AND OTHER DRUG ABUSE, INC. FAS REFERENCE PACKET

An FAS (Fetal Alcohol Syndrome) reference packet including medical research articles, technical and non-technical bibliographies (articles, pamphlets and audio-visuals), and a poster will be arriving by mail to all medical libraries in the state. The packets are part of a statewide effort to increase awareness among health professionals of the effects of maternal alcohol consumption on the unborn; they are a joint project of the Wisconsin Association on Alcoholism and Other Drug Abuse, Inc., Wisconsin Bureau of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse, and Wisconsin Clearinghouse for Alcohol and Other Drug Information.

The media campaign aimed at both health professionals and the general public will culminate in November, and it is hoped the packets will help librarians meet resulting requests for FAS information. It would be most helpful if librarians would publicize the packets' availability to persons using the library through in-house news publications and/or other locally available means. Cooperation is essential if the number of babies born at risk of FAS is to be decreased -- 3,000 every year in Wisconsin.

Although the questionnaires in the April newsletter generated only a 9% return, the overwhelming majority of those returned requested articles (86%) and posters (77%). WAAODA will attempt to meet specific requests of those returning the questionnaire. Thanks for your cooperation with the questionnaire.
