NORTHERN WISCONSIN HEALTH SCIENCE LIBRARIES
COOPERATIVE MEETING

The Northern Wisconsin Health Science Libraries Cooperative held its spring semi-annual meeting at the new Wausau Hospital Center in Wausau on Friday, April 27, 1979.

A survey conducted by coordinator, Deb Gilles, in January revealed the members interests and the Cooperative will begin new projects this year. Committee assignments were made and the projects include a Cooperative Policy and Procedure Handbook and a Union List of Professional Tools. Some members of the Cooperative are also making themselves available as consultants to other member and non-member area hospitals. Also discussed at the meeting was the grant for OCLC expansion to include intertype libraries/consortia within the Wisconsin Valley Library System.

Al Zimmerman and Alana Ziaya, Marshfield Clinic Medical Center Library, gave tips on claiming journals and Peg Allen, St. Joseph's School of Nursing Learning Resource Center, Marshfield, had tips concerning copyright and obtaining permission to copy for classroom use.

Following lunch, our hostess, Terry Libro, gave members a tour of the new Center. Although construction is not complete, moving in has begun and it is an impressive facility.

After the tour there was a brief workshop on the basics of cataloging.

PREVENTION PROJECT

The Central Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled Library Information Center and the Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services, Office of Program Support, are jointly working on a project designed to identify model primary prevention activities and to implement those activities on a pilot basis through Forest, Vilas and Oneida County 51.42 Boards, Portage County 51.42 Board and Columbia County 51.4236 Board. In addition, a prevention training program is being developed and will be presented throughout the state. It is hoped that a prevention component becomes a part of the curricula for training health related personnel statewide. The library information center is developing a collection of prevention materials, both AV and print to support this project. The project is sponsored by the Wisconsin Council on Developmental Disabilities. LOCAL PROCESSING CENTER MAKES GOOD

First a good idea, next an LSCA grant proposal, then a feasibility study, and now REALITY -- the long-awaited State Agency Processing Center has begun full operation. The Center acquires, catalogs on OCLC, and prepares library materials for six state agency libraries: Department of Administration, Department of Health and Social Services, Department of Natural Resources, Mendota Mental Health Institute Staff Library, Department of Local Affairs and Development, and Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations Bureau of Research and Statistics.

Partially funded by an LSCA grant, the Processing Center currently shares Reference and Loans OCLC terminals. In the future, the Center hopes to expand participation and become self-sufficient by charging for services on a cost-recovery basis. Want to learn more about the Processing Center?
