Frustrations, understanding, communication barriers, new directions - all these issues were part of the July 13th MHSLN assembly as members and committee chair worked to prioritize the committee's objectives and determine the direction for the coming year.

MHSLN ASSEMBLY - JULY MEETING (continued)

Due to the long range planning structure of MHSLN many committees had arrived at culminating and/or production activities at approximately the same time, putting a strain on funding resources. Because of the need, Margaret Ovitsky, the new MHSLN Program Coordinator, responded that she would like to direct a larger portion of her work toward grant expertise and grant writing. The assembly affirmed her decision and alternative sources of funding should continue to give added support to the committees work.

Some of the business items included a report of the competitive bidding for the Regional Medical Library. Two new Limited Designated Libraries (LDL) were added with a decision to evaluate the present application form. A list of potential authors for the Basic Library Management Manual was accepted - that rewriting project is funded and should be in process this fall.

Wisconsin persons with important tasks at the meeting included Ruth Holst of Columbia Hospital, Milwaukee, serving as Council President for the past two years and attending her last meeting in that capacity. Virginia Holtz, Director, Middleton Health Sciences Library, Madison, began her term as Assembly Chairperson for the coming year at the conclusion of the meeting. She succeeds David Curry of the University of Iowa.

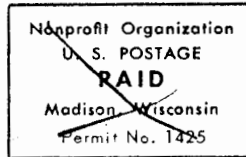

A50 BASIC LIBRARY MANAGEMENT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIANS

For the 25th consecutive year, A50-Basic Library Management for Public Librarians will be offered cooperatively by the University of Wisconsin—Extension, Communication Programs and by the Division for Library Services, Department of Public Instruction. For librarians employed in public libraries in Wisconsin, particularly in the smaller ones, this noncredit course serves as a training program which, if satisfactorily completed, meets the education requirement for a public librarian license, grade two or three, issued by the Division for Library Services. After completing the course and one year of satisfactory work in the library, a public librarian certificate will be issued to the individual.

Jane Roeber is the course instructor. There will be 13 two-hour class sessions over ETN plus a day-long meeting in Madison, which will be considered the first class session. The course design includes assigned readings, lectures, class discussions, written assignments which are corrected and returned to the students, and take-home midterm and final exams.
