MRG/MLA MEETING

"Health information: An idea we can live with". MLA continuing education courses, and the annual Council meeting - Three days of informative sessions was the format for the fall MRG/MLA meeting held on September 27-29 in Minneapolis.

The central conference on Friday saw a wealth of participants from various segments of the consumer health information area. These participants ranged from a lawyer to primary care providers, from librarians to health educators. Guests for a major portion of the afternoon session were Eleanor Goodchild and Ellen Gartenfeld, coordinators of unique networks utilizing the resources of the health science libraries and public libraries to deliver health information to the public.

Elections placed Wisconsin people on the MRG Governing Board and the MHSLN Council. Anne Taylor of the VA Hospital Library, Madison and Debra Gilles of Howard Young Medical Center Library, Woodruff were elected to the MRG Governing Board. Joan Zweifel, St. Mary's Medical Center Library will serve as president-elect of the MHSLN Council and Deb Gilles is the Wisconsin representative. Congratulations to these people.

Barbara Brian, Director, Library Services, Mercy Hospital, Coon Rapids, Minnesota is currently serving as the MHSLN Council President.

MHSLN ASSEMBLY - STATE LIBRARY MEETING

A "first" meeting was held in Chicago, October 4-5 following the MHSLN Assembly meeting. Representatives from resource libraries, state library agencies and interlibrary loan services met to exchange information about the library structure and networking of the six states in the MHSLN region, and to participate in planning sessions to determine modes of cooperation already in existence and ways to facilitate future cooperative work.

Cooperative needs were identified in a total group setting and each state then chose a concern which the state participants felt most applicable to their area. The major problem identified was the fragmented approach to library network development within the states. Because Wisconsin is already working on that issue, they chose to work on the issue of health information for consumers. Problems identified were territory - who is responsible for what; attitude - the public, public librarians, and health science librarians; and knowledge. Some preliminary steps of action were proposed. Watch for more about this meeting and follow-up in MHSLN Resources, the Newsletter and Channel DLS.

Several new committees were formed at the Assembly meeting held prior to the State/Assembly meeting. One of the committees established was an Interlibrary Loan committee, organized to plan for both short range and long range issues in ILL. A second committee in the area of planning process was appointed to assist with the progress of committee work from design to implementation. It also has the responsibility for recruiting committee members for vacancies when they occur. The Locator/Union List committee was augmented until the next Assembly to include representatives from each state in order that each states progress may be known.

It was announced that The Guide to Libraries & Library Subject Strengths is ready to be published and will appear as individual state sections. It will list 690 libraries in the region.

Haas, Frederick. "Problem-solving techniques that always cause problems." Supervisory Management, v. 24 (9) September 1979, p. 16.

The author presents eight situations in which a manager or acting manager can employ "stalling" techniques in a decision-making setting. Situations include: delegating an unpleasant or time-consuming duty and saving face in spite of the delegation; giving information on a topic of which you are considered the expert but know nothing about; handling a decision in your director's absence and returning a message you don't wish to deal with by avoiding contact with the caller.

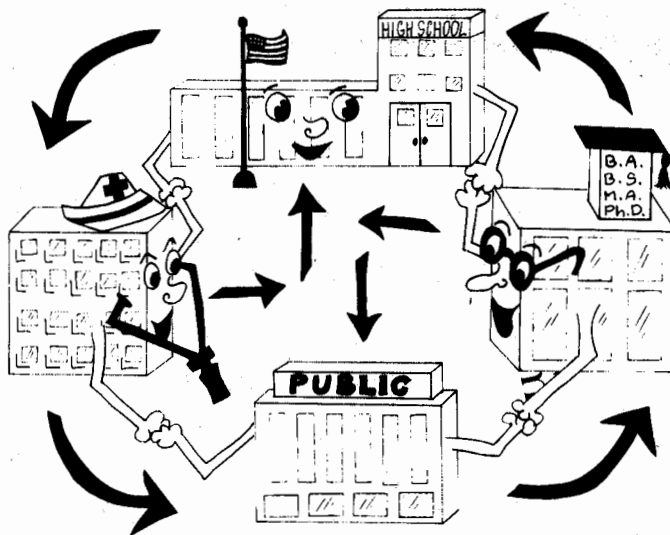

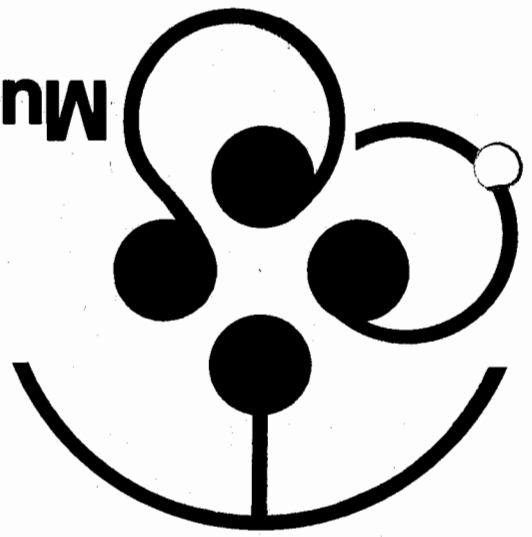
