STATE INTERLIBRARY LOAN STATISTICS.

The new form for the 1980-81 State Health Science Library interlibrary loan statistics is included in this newsletter. If you are a consortium member you are to send them to your designated consortium statistics person at the intervals requested by your consortium. Also send any other data your consortium may request. If you are a non-consortium library send them to Barbara Schmiechen at Middleton HSL on November 1, 1980 and June 1, 1981.

You will notice that there are several changes-

- 1) Format. We felt the use of less repetitive words and the placing of the recording spaces closer to the phrases will make the forms easier to read and to use.
- 2) Non-health science libraries. You are now asked to record your interlibrary loan activity with non-health science libraries both in Wisconsin and in the region. Part of this statistic is required by the Region and the Wisconsin figure is important for our future planning in regard to state multitype library cooperation.
- 3) Question #5. This question is repeated in both the borrowing and lending sections of the form and may be confusing. In both question 4 and 5 we are attempting to identify your non-MHSLN Network interlibrary loan traffic. If you are in a consortium question 5 means all loans to non-consortium health science oriented libraries throughout Region VII. This is sometimes hard to determine so if there is a question put it in #3.

Please be consistent in returning this form with any other information your consortium requests.

PROGRESS REPORT ON MHSLN STRUCTURE

In 1978, the Midwest Health Science Library Network (MHSLN) Council President (Ruth Holst) submitted to the Assembly of Resource Libraries the Council's view on the necessity of revising the regional advisory and policy making structure. An Ad Hoc Committee on MHSLN Structure was appointed in March, 1979. Since its appointment, the Committee has discussed proposals for a new structure and has gathered input from members of the Region.

In March of this year, the Council Governing Board met and submitted its recommendation of principles to be incorporated in any proposals for the restructuring of the Region. Also in March, the Consortium Coordinators met and discussed the restructuring. The Assembly met in April to consider the issue. Meeting independently, these groups agreed that basic units, the Resource Libraries and the Regional Medical Library (RML) should be represented on the governing body. Each group's proposals also called for the formation of State Councils. Although the groups arrived at the same general conclusions, they differed in the detail and weights given. In a recent progress report, the Structure Committee identified areas still requiring a decision including: 1) What is the desired composition of the State Councils? and 2) What is to be the final profile of representation in the regional body- what entities represented and how many representatives?

The Committee is currently refining its proposals for publication in the summer issue of Resources, with a further solicitation of input to the Committee. Further refinement of alternatives will then be undertaken. There will then be discussions at the fall meeting of the Assembly (Oct. 14) and the Council (September 18-19). A mail ballot will be sent to all Council and Assembly members following those meetings. The Council vote will be an advisory one to the Assembly. Differences will then be reconciled and final adoption by the Assembly will enable implementation of a new Regional structure on January 1, 1981.

Be watching Resources for more information and plan to attend the Council meeting on September 18-19 at the University of Illinois, Chicago. MHSLN COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP

WISCONSIN COUNCIL ON LIBRARY AND NETWORK DEVELOPMENT

In May, Governor Dreyfus signed the Assembly Bill 20 which deals, among other things, with the planning of library services for the people of Wisconsin. A key feature of the bill is the creation of the Council on Library and Network Development, which will advise the State Superintendent of Public Instruction (in whose department major responsibility for state-level planning of library services is placed) on a wide range of important matters. This Council is to be composed of 15 members, appointed by the Governor, eight of whom are to be persons with professional or trustee relationship to libraries and seven are to be lay persons.

Representatives of various library organizations and interested groups met in Stevens Point in May to assemble a list of leaders in the library field to submit to the Governor for his consideration in making the appointments to the Council.

Bessie Stein, Director of the Todd Wehr Library, Medical College of Wisconsin appears on the list that was presented to the Governor. People are urged to send letters of support for her to the Governor or his assistant Sue Kaestner, State Capitol, Madison, 53702.

FOX RIVER VALLEY COOPERATIVE

The spring meeting of the Fox River Valley Area Library Cooperative was held April 25, 1980 at Lakeshore Technical Institute with Linda McCabe as hostess. Mary Bayorgeon reported on the meeting on the Council of Wisconsin Librarians held March 2, 1980 in Madison. Barb Schmiechen was present to report on WHSLA activities and MEDLARS III, the next step in computerized data base from the National Library of Medicine. The group responded favorably to a request from MHSLN Management Office to support the Consortia Buddy System. New officers were elected to serve the 1980/81 term. They are as follows: Dan Eckert-Coordinator, Mary Hanegraaf-Coordinator Elect, Karen Henning-Secretary/Treasurer. After reviewing the statistics of the consortia's Interlibrary Loans, a committee was formed to investigate Interlibrary Loan Resource Sharing costs. The fall meeting will be held at St. Nicholas Hospital, Sheboygan on Friday, September 26, 1980.

Peg Allen, Program Committee Chairman, reported on the 1980 Wisconsin Health Science Library Association to be held on October 16-17, 1980, in Marshfield. The theme is "Targeting Health Science Library Services". There will be two continuing education courses on Thursday, followed by a program and business meeting on Friday. The Northern Wisconsin Health Science Libraries Cooperative is hosting the meeting.

Other business included distribution of the Cooperative's first Policy and Procedure Handbook; an update on the Union List of Professional Tools; reports from several members on the meetings of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Network Advisory Council, the Consortium Coordinators, the Wisconsin Health Science Library Association Executive Board; and a review of the status of the MHSLN Structure Committee's work. Peg Allen, St. Joseph's Hospital, Marshfield, was elected Coordinator-Elect.

Following a tour of the Howard Young Medical Center Library and lunch, Deb Gilles, Coordinator, presented an educational program describing the MEDLINE data bases and explaining MEDLINE searching.

COUNCIL OF HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIES TO MHSN

The Council of Health Sciences Libraries to MHSN is the Region's user group, open to any institution participating in MHSN programs. Council membership enables program users to have a formal voice in the decision making process for the Region. As a focus for the needs of program users, the Council brings to the attention of the Assembly of Resource Libraries and the Management Office issues of concern to those members, and it recommends areas of program activity. Over 400 institutions currently hold membership in the Council.

WHY SHOULD MY LIBRARY JOIN THE COUNCIL?

- So that you may "speak up" about your library's experiences with MHSN programs.
- So that you can work cooperatively with other program users to improve and extend MHSN programs.

HOW DOES THE COUNCIL OPERATE?

- Each institutional member (library) designates an official Council Representative, authorized to vote on Council matters on behalf of the institution.
- Elected Officers include a President, President-elect, Immediate Past President, and Recording Secretary, and a Governing Board consisting of one representative from each state in MHSN.
- The President-elect chairs the Agenda Committee which seeks input from Council Representatives and presents issues to the Council Officers and Governing Board for Action.
- The Council President is a voting member of the Assembly of Resource Libraries, the regional policy determining group.
- Issues are brought to the full membership at an annual meeting held each fall. Elections for Officers and Governing Board members occur at this meeting.
- Council Representatives may be asked to serve as elected Officers and/or on ad hoc and standing Council Committees.

Lastly, tips on how to ask the questions are given as well as how to record the answers in an objective manner.
