A51 BASIC LIBRARY MANAGEMENT

Wisconsin people still have time to register for the A51 Basic Management for Health Science Librarians, an ETN course that begins October 13. North Dakota participants will again be joining us for the course.

If you are a new library manager or interested in health science librarianship, this is a course for you to consider. It is an introductory course and therefore presents a broad overview. The course format includes lectures, sharing sessions among participants, and assigned projects.

SEMINARS FOR HEALTH SCIENCE LIBRARIANS

This issue of the Newsletter includes the announcement of the 1980-81 Seminars for Health Science Librarians. They will be held on the first Wednesday of every other month beginning November 1 from 10:00-11:50.

Registration is important for this course as materials and CEU credit are sent to registrants only. It also gives strong indication to the sponsoring units that there is a continuing education commitment on the part of Health Science Librarians, and is an important evaluation tool when assigning network time each planning year. Your support was strong last year, let's continue to maintain that level of participation.

NEW BRS/PRE-MED DATABASE

Bibliographic Retrieval Services (BRS) has announced the availability of a new data base called PRE-MED. The purpose of the new file, is to provide immediate access to citations from key medical journals PREVIOUS to their appearance in MEDLINE.

Because currency is critical to medical personnel, PRE-MED provides online access to the 125 key journals that compare the coverage for the Abridged Index Medicus (AIM). Citations from these journals should appear in the PRE-MED database within ten days after their appearance on the shelves of the major health science libraries. PRE-MED will fill the gap between the publication of these important journals and the appearance of resulting citations in MEDLINE 5-12 weeks later. Because of the rapidity with which these citations appear the articles will not be indexed as tightly as those in MEDLINE, but it should provide good access to very current issues. It is expected that the file will contain approximately 5,000 citations and will be updated on a weekly basis.

Both Middleton HSL and Todd Wehr Library MCW have BRS computer searching capacity. This is a separate file and must be searched independently of MEDLINE. Prices vary with each institution.

STATE PEOPLE

Marilyn Sullivan of Todd Wehr Library, Medical College of Wisconsin has accepted the responsibility of writing the Wisconsin Chapter for the revised edition of Basic Management for Health Sciences Librarians. She may be calling on any of you for information concerning state services.

Shelley Jordan of Bellin Memorial Hospital, Green Bay has been named to the Consortium Formation Committee of MHSLN. Shelley was formerly Consortium Coordinator of the Fox River Cooperative.

Eileen Emberson, Director of the Health Sciences Library, Luther Hospital, Eau Claire, submitted an LSCA grant proposal to develop a cooperative program in consumer education. Luther has been notified that the grant has been awarded. More details later.

UW-MADISON DEFERRAL OF LIBRARY BOOK PURCHASES

As many of our friends around the state are aware, the University of Wisconsin-Madison has deferred the purchase of library books for the balance of 1980-81 or until such time as funds are available to restore the book budget. This step was taken in reaction to the abrupt reduction in State support for the University after the program year was well underway. Every effort will be made to lift the restriction on the purchase of books during the second half of the fiscal year.

In the meanwhile, we expect to continue providing service as usual to all of the hospitals and other agencies around the State and Region insofar as we are able. Requests should continue to be sent to the Middleton for filling or referring. We had already purchased books before the freeze was enacted so our supply of current materials is not wholly affected. In addition we are still receiving monographs in series and other formats which are purchased under our serials budget. Other orders are being stockpiled in readiness for the time when funds are restored. We will do all that we can to minimize the effect of this very serious step on all of those who depend on us for back-up services.

The University realizes how serious the impact of this step could be on both the University community here in Madison and on the many agencies with which the University has cooperative arrangements. However, the choices were limited.

Toxic Shock Syndrome bibliography

Late in 1979 and early in 1980, we were inundated with requests for information on something called "toxic shock syndrome." We had a terrible time locating articles on the subject - MESH does not use the subject heading TOXIC SHOCK, it uses SHOCK, SEPTIC. We later learned, too, that the syndrome was just very recently being identified and described so it was too soon for many of the articles written to be indexed.

Since it seemed to be growing in importance, 3 possible cases had been seen in our hospital and the state of Wisconsin was at the forefront of the whole investigative process, we decided to keep a record of all references we originally found and those we were adding as we came upon them. EXPANDED NEW ONLINE CENTERS

Since the moratorium on adding new users to the NLM online network was lifted in March, centers joining the network have had access only to the SUNY (Albany) computers and the NLM data bases available there. Beginning August 1 these centers will be able to search the remaining data bases by dialing into the NLM computers; in effect, all online centers now have access to the full range of NLM online services available on the MEDLARS/MEDLINE network.

The expanded access is made possible because NLM will be installing an IBM 370/168 MP system in the near future, significantly increasing computer capacity over the present 370/158 MP system.

EXPANDED NEW ONLINE CENTERS - Continued

New users will have access to the following data bases in NLM's computers: CATLINE, AVLINE, NAME AUTHORITY, SERLINE, CANCERLIT, CANCERPROJ, CLINPROT, EPILEPSY, BIOETHICS, HISTLINE, and HEALTH PLANNING & ADMINISTRATION. Access will also be provided to the SDILINE data base, although it is available at SUNY, so that users may store searches for the automatic SDI program, which is only available at NLM. In addition, "SUNY-only" users will be given access to MEDLEARN at NLM. These users will continue to use the other data bases (MEDLINE and its backfiles, TOXLINE/TOXBACK, CHEMLINE, RTECS, TDB and MESH VOCABULARY) at SUNY only; their codes will not allow access to these data bases at NLM.

We hope that this added access will provide better service to our new users without further straining the NLM computer resources. All users are encouraged to use the SUNY computers whenever possible to equalize the system loads.

NEW MLA PUBLICATION

Introduction to Reference Sources in the Health Sciences was authored by Fred W. Roper, School of Library Science; and Jo Anne Boorkman, Health Sciences Library; both at the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill. The book is a guide to the reference literature and information sources and a basis for reference work in the field. The book highlights selected works frequently used by reference librarians, with particular emphasis on U. S. publications. Bibliographic and informational sources are reviewed extensively, and examples of the most important tools in each area are given. The use of the tools in answering reference questions is emphasized, and additional readings are included.

A NURSING AUDIOCASSETTE COURSE FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY

Counseling Procedures for Nursing Instructors by Dolore Rockers.

An audiocassette course, has been specifically designed to assist nursing instructors as they function in the counseling role. Course content includes an overview of counseling theories, components of the counseling interview, and the application of counseling procedures. In addition to taped lectures, the course utilizes case studies, interview segments, readings, and self-assessments to provide a variety of learning experiences. Extensive bibliographies are included for the nurse who wishes more information on specific topics.

The eight lessons in N80 - COUNSELING PROCEDURES FOR NURSING INSTRUCTORS include audio-taped cassettes, lesson outlines, and reference lists. In addition, suggested independent activities enhance learner involvement.

Courses are available for purchase in two formats: \$50.00 with 8 cassettes (plus \$2.00 service charge) or \$25.00 without tapes (plus \$2.00 service charge).

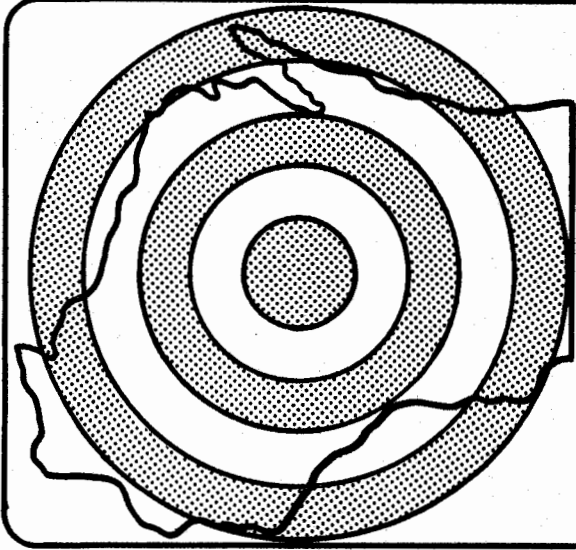

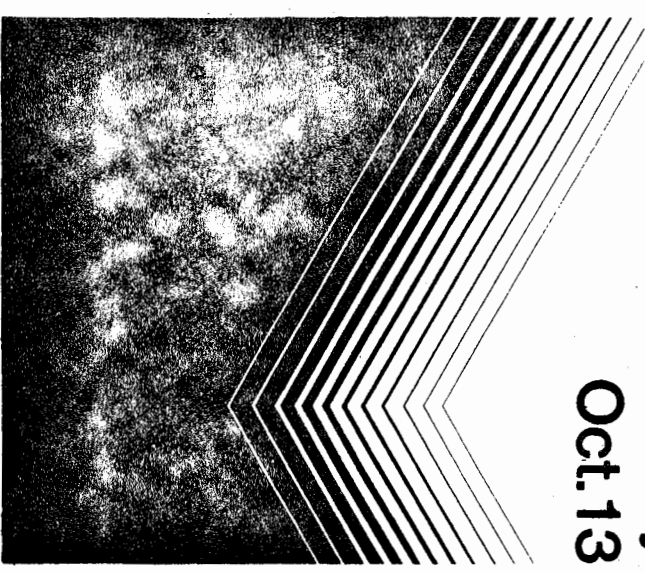
