ETN SEMINAR ON ASSERTIVENESS

What does assertiveness mean in terms of interpersonal communication? How does assertiveness affect health sciences librarians? Join the ETN Network Wednesday, March 4 at 10:00 for the third Health Sciences Librarian's Seminar at which time Pat Prindle of UW Extension, Department of Continuing Education in Mental Health will be our guest for a program on assertiveness. Role playing will also be a part of the program.

Pat is experienced in leading assertiveness training workshops. He currently holds a faculty position in UW-Extension specializing in rural mental health. Before coming to Wisconsin in 1979 he spent a number of years in Ohio, working in the mental health field. He is also completing a doctorate in clinical community psychology.

CONSORTIUM COORDINATORS MEETING

All persons interested in consortium activities are welcome to attend the 1981 region-wide consortium coordinators meeting in Minneapolis, March 26-27. A registration form can be found elsewhere in the Newsletter. Hotel reservations must be made directly to the Curtis Hotel, the site of the Meeting.

The theme "Consortia in a wider world: critical issues" sets the agenda for the day and a half program beginning Thursday March 26 and continuing through Friday noon, March 27. Large blocks of time will be given to programs dealing with approaches to service measurement, and library/consortium applications of new technology.

Time will also be given for an assessment of future program planning for regional consortia activities as well as for state meetings to transact state business.

Wisconsin people will meet at 8:00 Thursday to work on the guidelines for state council formation that will be presented to the MHSLN Council and then to the Assembly for final approval. This will then open the way for a Wisconsin representative to be elected to the Regional Governing Body by the July Assembly meeting.



MILWAUKEE CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

There are only 124 free-standing pediatric hospitals in the United States. Free-standing meaning that they are not part of a larger university hospital or medical center complex. Milwaukee Children's Hospital is the only such pediatric specialty hospital in Wisconsin. It is a private, not-for-profit hospital; receiving most of its support adjacent to or owned by the Medical College of Wisconsin, it is the primary pediatric teaching affiliate and the location of the Medical College of Wisconsin Department of Pediatrics.

The Hospital provides the Health Sciences Library as a support service area to meet the patient care needs of its Medical-Dental Staff and employees. The collection is; therefore, primarily clinical pediatrics and related disciplines. It was created in 1976 by the merger of collections from the Nursing and Medical Staff collections, with donations from individuals and hospital departments. In four years the journal collection has grown from less than 60 titles to over 140; more than 50 of which are specifically pediatric.

To provide more rapid access to clinical pediatric literature, the Health Sciences Library will accept requests from other Wisconsin health science libraries. Please use local consortium or library resources first, but reasonable requests for our unique holdings will be filled. WHSLA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES
October 16, 1980
Marshfield, Wisconsin

The Fall Meeting of the Executive Board of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Association was called to order at 11:15 a.m. by President Joy Shong.

Members present included Mary Bayorgeon, Kay Cimpl, Ellen Cooper, Eileen Emberson, Deb Gilles, Debbie Hall, Ruth Holst, Betsy Merriam and Joy Shong. Absent members: Dan Eckert and Ann Taylor. Guests: Peggy Allen, Mary Hanegraaf, Margaret Marik, Barb Schmiechen and Al Zimmerman.

The Minutes of the March 28, 1980 meeting were highlighted by Secretary Ruth Holst.

Peggy Allen, 1980 Program Chairman, announced that 30 registrations had been received for the Fall meeting of WHSLA. Eileen Emberson expressed the opinion that the Board should have greater control in decisions relating to program expenses, specifically instructor's honoraria and expenses. President Shong suggested that the Program Committee needed better guidelines for planning the financial aspects of the meeting. As a result, Joy will write new charges for both the Program and Education Committees relating to the writing of guidelines for handling instructor expenses and other details of program planning.

Al Zimmerman reported that recommended changes in the Bylaws appeared in the October 1980 WHSLA Newsletter and will be voted upon by mail ballot later in the year. Joy Shong announced that an additional change will be presented from the floor at the Fall WHSLA meeting on the next day. This change relates to the reversal of the words "odd" and "even" in Art. IV, Section 5a & b: Selection of Members of the Executive Board. The change is needed because the annual meeting has been moved to Spring and current board members will serve as additional half year.

Deb Gilles reported that the Association has 117 members to date, compared with 113 in the Fall of 1979. The Membership Committee has compiled a packet of materials for new members and has written policies relating to the format, publication schedules and method of distribution of the Directory of Officers and Committees and the membership Listing. Deb passed out copies of these materials along with the 1980 Financial Statement.

Debbie Hall reported that she and Bess Stein will chair the Program Committee for the 1981 Annual Meeting of WHSLA in Milwaukee. Tentative dates for the meeting are May 7-8 or May 14-15, 1981. The planning committee has been selected and will meet for breakfast Friday morning, October 17.

WHSLA EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES (Con'd)

Joy reported that the members of the Incorporation Committee have completed their initial charges. She will appoint a new committee to complete the process of applying for incorporation.

Debbie Hall, chair of the Ad Hoc Guidelines Committee, asked the chairmen of all WHSLA Standing Committees to submit procedures for their respective committees. Betsy Merriam, a member of the Guideline Committee pointed out that theirs was not a policy-making committee but rather, was charged with compiling the policies and procedures of other committees into one source.

Barb Schmiechen reported that WHSLA logo stickers for use on envelopes were too expensive as an alternative to letterhead envelopes. The Association's new logo is being used for the WHSLA Newsletter and the new stationery will be printed soon. All members of the Board have received copies of the agreement between WHSLA and Middleton Health Sciences Library which describes the Association contribution to the costs of printing and distributing the WHSLA Newsletter. It was agreed that the Treasurer will be responsible for presenting the updated copy of the agreement to the Board annually at its Fall meeting. The Treasurer will make the annual payment, which applies to the calendar year, in January and will write a procedure for the Association's guidelines.

Kay Cimpl volunteered to chair the new Planning and Development Committee which will also include Ellen Cooper, Ruth Holst, Mary Hanegraff, Su Mallampalli and Betsy Merriam.

Betsy Merriam, of the Legislation Committee, passed out information sheets on two items: (1) the Wisconsin Interlibrary Loan Guidelines and (2) The Wisconsin Library Network Plan Project. Betsy urged health science librarians to lobby for their interests with the state library network.

Joy asked each committee chairman to give a brief report at the business meeting on the next day.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
