WISCONSIN COUNCIL

The Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Net-
work Advisory Council (WHSLNAC) was just begin-
ning to be a familiar title and acronym as
work has proceeded for the past year to de-
velop an institutional voice for the health
sciences libraries in the State.

This Advisory Council is now blossoming into
full council status as a result of the Mid-
west Health Sciences Library Network restruc-
ture plan. That plan asks for each state in
the MHSLN region to develop a state council
to carry out the work of the Region at the
state level. MHSLN restructure mandates each
council to develop guidelines, plan for facil-
itating communication, and to elect a state
representative to the MHSLN Assembly.

The work of developing guidelines began some
time ago with Wisconsin MHSLN Council Represen-
tative Deb Gilles leading this project. On
March 26 in Minneapolis WHSLNAC members and
interested persons met to work on the rough
draft for the guidelines of the Wisconsin coun-
cil. Deb Gilles and Al Zimmerman will do the
refining of the final draft for approval at
the WHSLNAC meeting May 7.

Mary Bayorgeon, Bess Stein, and Barbara Schmie-
chen are serving on the Nominating Committee
to select candidates for the State Representative
position and subsequently the alternate; and
for a member-at-large position for the Wiscon-
sin Council.

After the guidelines are adopted the acronym
WHSLNAC with which you are becoming familiar
will then become CWHSLN - THE COUNCIL OF WIS-
CONSIN HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIES NETWORK.

PROPOSED GUIDELINES OF THE COUNCIL OF WISCONSIN HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIES

PROPOSED GUIDELINES OF THE COUNCIL OF WISCONSIN
HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIES - Continued

A. Name

The name of this organization shall be the Council of Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network, hereafter referred to as the Council.

B. Purpose

The purpose of the Council shall be:

1. To promote health sciences library services in Wisconsin.
2. To address network operational problems and needs of health sciences libraries in Wisconsin.
3. To provide a forum for the development of positions on state, regional and national health sciences library issues.
4. To communicate with the Regional Assembly of the Midwest Health Sciences Library Network.
5. To coordinate activities to meet the objectives of the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network.

C. Membership

The Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network is composed of libraries or library services in hospitals, health planning agencies, organizations, or institutions with health related programs. Membership is institutional.

Composition of the Council

1. The coordinator or representative from each health sciences library consortium in Wisconsin recognized by MHSLN.
2. The director or representative from each of the MHSLN Resource Libraries in Wisconsin.
3. The Wisconsin Coordinator for Health Science Libraries.
4. The president or representative of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Assoc.
5. The representative to the MHSLN Assembly elected by the MHSLN members in Wisconsin, if not already a member of the Council.
6. The alternate representative to the MHSLN Assembly elected by the MHSLN members in Wisconsin, if not already a member of the Council.
7. One member-at-large from unaligned units.

D. Officers

1. A chair shall be elected from within the Council. The chair shall notify Council members of meetings; prepare an agenda, preside at the meetings of the Council and handle Council correspondence. The Wisconsin Coordinator for Health Sciences Libraries will take minutes of all meetings and distribute them to the Council members. The chair shall serve a one year term.
2. The representative to the MHSLN regional Assembly shall attend the MHSLN Assembly meetings and represent the state's interests and concerns at these meetings and report back to the Council and Network on the meetings and other MHSLN activities. The representative shall serve a three year term. The representative shall serve as Chair of the Assembly if elected.

3. The alternate representative to the MHSLN Assembly shall serve in the absence of the representative or upon resignation of the representative fulfilling the unexpired term or if the representative is elected to serve as Chair of the Assembly. The alternate shall serve a three year term.

The representative and the alternate shall be eligible to serve two consecutive terms.

4. The member-at-large to the Council shall serve a two year term.

E. Elections

1. Nominating Committee

- a. The nominating committee shall be composed of 3 members from the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network and appointed by the chair of the Council six months prior to the seating of the elected.
- b. The nominating committee shall prepare a slate for the offices of representative and alternate to the MHSLN Assembly and the member-at-large. The slate shall consist of three nominees for the position of representative; the person receiving the highest number of votes becoming the representative and the person receiving the second highest number of votes becoming the alternate. Two (2) members-at-large shall also be nominated with the highest vote-getters being elected.

2. Election Procedure

An election committee appointed by the Council Chair shall count ballots and report results. There shall be a mail ballot of all MHSLN members in Wisconsin (3) months prior to the seating of the representative. Should the representative be elected Chair at the MHSLN Assembly, the alternate shall assume the position of the representative and a new alternate shall be appointed by the Chair at the next Council meeting. Vacancies shall be filled by a Chair appointment.

F. Meetings

1. The Council shall meet at least twice each year. All meetings shall be open to members of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Network.
2. Business between meetings shall be conducted by mail, phone, the WHSLA Newsletter, at the end of ETN programs, by correspondence from the representative, or by the Wisconsin Coordinator who attends consortium meetings throughout the State.

MEDICAL LIBRARY ASSISTANCE ACT RENEWAL (MLAA)

Two Medical Library Assistance Renewal bills have been introduced in Congress. The MLAA includes funding for the NLM Regional Medical Library programs and NLM grant programs.

On March 27 Senator Hatch introduced a bill into the Senate that would renew the Medical Library Assistance Act for three years. This bill carries

the Senate bill number S.800. The major provisions of this bill call for a three year MLAA with a funding level at six million, 33% lower than the current 1981 funding at 9.8 million. This would eliminate all training, publications and scientific projects, leaving the RML, Resource Grants and some research at a lower funding level. MLA is asking for 1) Letters to be sent to the Senate Labor and Human Resource Committee supporting the bill but indicating grave concern over the funding level. Letters must be in by April 15 to be included in the hearing record. You must indicate a desire to have your correspondence placed in the hearing record. 2) Your solicitation of letters from library users. These would be extremely helpful. The feeling is that the bill will go into conference.

Henry Waxman of California has introduced a bill (HR 2562) in the House calling for a one year extension of MLAA at 9 million, the approximate current level. The rationale being that the one year extension gives time to study the bill, for many health funding bills are now pending. MLA suggests 1) Letters be sent to Rep. Henry Waxman, Chair of the Health and Environment sub-committee indicating support for HR 2562 Title V. Hearings will begin April 6. The hearing record will be open until April 20. There will be no public witnesses so letters from library users are extremely important. Time is of the essence because the bill must be out of conference by May 15. Indicate in the letter that more renewal years would be important for long range planning. Also indicate grave concern about Senate Bill S.800 funding level.
