## NATIONAL MEDIA AUDIOVISUAL CENTER VIDEOCASSETTE INTERLIBRARY LOAN

Both NLM Fact Sheet and MHSNL Resources have contained articles about NMAC's new inter-library loan policies for videocassettes. The satellite collection described in those articles has been received at the MHSNL Resource Medical Library at the University of Illinois at the Medical Center. The list of titles in that satellite collection is included as an addendum to the MHSNL Interlibrary Loan Manual which you should have received recently.

Guidelines for requesting materials are reprinted here from Resources to reiterate those policies and procedures. Refer also to the January 1981 National Library of Medicine's Fact Sheet for further information.

"1. By April 1981, an initial satellite collection composed of videocassettes produced by NMAC from 1975 to the present will be deposited at the Library of the Health Sciences, University of Illinois at the Medical Center, in the Multimedia Department. Eventually, this satellite collection will be expanded to include videocassettes produced between 1970 and 1974. Once the satellite collection is received, a printed list of titles will be distributed with Resources. These titles are currently listed in the NLM AV Catalog and are tagged "NMAC-ILL" in AVLINE, along with other titles available for loan. Neither the NLM AV Catalog nor AVLINE specifically designates these as satellite collection titles.

Follow these guidelines for requesting titles in the satellite collection:

- a. Send the request to your local Resource Library, if you can verify that the material is held there. If the request is filled, you will be responsible for any charges. If your request is referred, it will be supported with RML program funds, under MHSLN document delivery program guidelines.
  - b. If you cannot verify that the requested material is held at your local Resource Library, send your request directly to the University of Illinois, Library of the Health Sciences, Multimedia Department in Chicago. If the request is filled, you will be responsible for any charges. Requests referred to NMAC will be free of charge.
2. In addition to the videocassettes being made available through the satellite collection, NMAC will also loan other videocassettes in its collection. Again, these titles are listed in the NLM AV Catalog and are specifically identified in AVLINE by the words "NMAC-ILL" in the procurement field. Please follow these guidelines for requesting videocassettes which are available on loan from NMAC but are not included in the satellite collection:
- a. Send the request to your local Resource Library if you can verify that the item is held there. If the request is filled, you will be responsible for any charges. If your request is referred, it will be supported with RML program funds, under MHSLN document delivery program guidelines.
  - b. If you cannot verify that the requested material is held by a local Resource Library, send the request directly to NMAC (this policy may seem contradictory to the one which is described in the NLM Fact Sheet, but NMAC has approved these guidelines for MHSLN). Be sure to consult the enclosed Fact Sheet for instructions on borrowing videocassettes from NMAC. Requests filled by NMAC will be provided free of charge. "

# Do you have questions about copyright? We have answers.

"May I reprint a Peanuts cartoon in my newspaper, as long as I say where I got it?"

"Is it all right to reproduce copies of a Beatles song lyric and pass them out to my English class? May I do the same with a scholarly article on the literary merits of those same lyrics? Must my school orchestra pay royalties if it performs those same lyrics with music?"

"If I rephrase the text in my own words, will I violate copyright?"

"Can we protect our computer programs with copyright?"

"Who owns the copyright to a published article, the writer or the publisher?"

"What happens if I violate the copyright of another?"

The revised copyright law, which went into effect January 1, 1978, has generated much confusion and anxiety.

Attorney Michael Skindrud has straight-forward answers to many questions on copyright and can offer useful rules for those questions without simple answers. Michael will share his insights into the new law in a practical, day-long workshop offered by UW-Extension on June 9, 1981 and again on October 27, 1981 at Madison's Wisconsin Center.

## Who should attend?

This workshop is for anyone interested in learning how the copyright law works, and especially:

\* Teachers who wish to reprint materials for classroom use;

\* Musicians and directors who wish to perform songs and plays;

\* Editors who plan to reprint material in their publications;

\* Graphic designers who use image as well as word in their work;

\* Librarians who permit copies to be made from their books and periodicals;

\* Researchers, scholars, reviewers, and writers who use and build on the ideas of others.

\* Business people who reproduce the manuals and designs of others.

## What will be covered?

The day begins with an overview of copyright law and the changes brought about by the new law.

Michael will explain how to determine whether material is protected by copyright, how to obtain permission to use the material if it is, whether the use you contemplate would violate another's copyright, and how to obtain copyright protection for your own work.

Along the way, Michael will discuss the rights conferred by copyright, the limitations imposed on these rights, including the fair use doctrine, the current confusion regarding the obligation to pay performance royalties for non-profit use, the difference between copyright violation and plagiarism, and the penalties for infringement of copyright.

There will be ample time for your questions.

## Who will teach the workshop?

Michael Skindrud is uniquely qualified to conduct workshops on copyright law.

As attorney, teacher, and performing artist, Michael has examined all aspects of copyright.

Michael earned his law degree with honors from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 1975. After gaining admittance to the bar in both Wisconsin and Minnesota, he served as coordinator of the Arts Legal Assistance Program for the Affiliated States Arts Agencies of the Upper Midwest in Minneapolis and gave numerous legal education programs for arts groups and artists throughout the midwest on topics including copyright.

He returned to Madison to join the law firm of La Follette, Sinykin, Anderson, and Munson, where his practice includes work in copyright, trademark, and patent law.

Michael is a skillful and popular teacher for UW-Extension.
