ADA SELTZER TO TEACH NEOPLASIA COURSE

The MLA-CE Neoplasia course will begin Monday, February 15 at 10:00 a.m., and continue in that same ETN time slot on March 1, March 15, and March 29.

Ada Seltzer will be the instructor. She is currently Assistant Director for Public Services, Medical Center Library, University of Southern Florida at Tampa. That is a relatively new library and Ada not only has been on the staff there for 10 years, but helped develop the Library. She was in MLA's first apprenticeship program for instructors and has taught this course since 1979.

The Course syllabus has been revised since last Fall and all participants will receive copies of the new syllabus as well as a hand-out developed by Ada for the course. Prior to the first session, all participants will find it helpful to do background work by reading Harrison's Principles of Medicine, Part 5, Section 9, pp. 1583-1656 on Neoplasia.

ETN SEMINARS - MARCH 3

March brings with it quick snow storms, wind, Spring and also the third session in the ETN Seminars series. Elaine Leventhal, M.D. of the UW-Madison School of Medicine, and Pat Craven, Health Sciences Library, St. Marys Hospital are the speakers. Pat Craven currently serves as a Library Technician at St. Marys, and is Librarian for the Wisconsin Hospital Association. She completed her MLS in 1981, and is Co-chair of the 1982 WHSLA Annual Meeting. Dr. Leventhal is Director of the Subsection of Geriatric Medicine, Department of Medicine, UW-Madison School of Medicine and is a member of the CHS Task Force on Geriatrics and Gerontology.

The program theme is "Geriatric medicine and library services." Dr. Leventhal will speak on the state of the art and Pat Craven will report on her project at St. Marys in conducting a needs assessment of geriatric literature for the Library. She will also talk about the bibliography of geriatric medicine.

1981-DIRECTORY OF HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARIES

MHSLN has just released a very impressive publication. The 1981-Directory of Health Sciences Libraries is conveniently divided into individual state directories. The directory contains important information about the libraries, their directors and pertinent information for sharing resources. If you are a member of the Network you should have received a copy with your December 1981 issue of Resources. Additional directories are available from the Management Office for \$2.00 per state directory to MHSLN members and \$2.50 to non-MHSLN members. People may order any other state directories for their own use.

NLM ANNOUNCES RECONFIGURATION

The National Library of Medicine has announced a reconfiguration of the Regional Medical Library Network, the first major change in geographical boundaries in the network's 14-year history. Beginning in November, 1982, the present eleven regions will be reduced to seven.

The change will be effected by merging the five Eastern seaboard regions into two larger groupings and combining two existing regions in the Midwest. The four midcontinental, western, and southwestern regions remain unchanged.

The new configuration is designed to take advantage of the strong working relationships, program development, and spirit of cooperation developed in the various regions over the past 14 years, while providing a more cost-effective mechanism to meet current and anticipated budget constraints.

NLM ANNOUNCES RECONFIGURATION Continued

The Board of Regents of the National Library of Medicine, at its October 29-30 meeting, approved a resolution supporting the seven-region plan.

In connection with reconfiguration, NLM also reviewed the statement of mission and program goals of the Regional Medical Library Program. The Board approved a revised mission statement that says the RML Program shall:

"Provide health sciences practitioners, investigators, educators and administrators in the United States with timely, convenient access to health care and biomedical information resources. The Program is coordinated by the National Library of Medicine and carried out through a nationwide network of health-sciences libraries and information centers."

The Board also supported the Program's goals which emphasize the provision of information to health professionals wherever they may be, the use of modern technologies to provide this information in a timely, cost-effective manner, and the necessity for cooperation and sharing among health-science libraries and information centers.

A technical plan embodying these goals is now being developed. The plan will form the basis for a Request for Proposal to be issued early in 1982 soliciting contract proposals from institutions wishing to serve as Regional Medical Libraries in the new configuration.

Contracts are expected to be announced for the seven regions in August and September of 1982 with a phased changeover beginning in October. NLM does not plan to serve as a Regional Medical Library, but will continue its role as a backup resource to the Network.

A map illustrating the new regions is included in this Newsletter.

1982/83 NLM ASSOCIATE PROGRAM

The National Library of Medicine announces its Associate Program for the 1982/83 academic year. The NLM Associate Program is a one-year post-graduate training program for outstanding graduates of schools of library/information science.

The Associate Program provides an opportunity for studying the resources and services of the National Library of Medicine and for exploring research and development activities. The Program prepares Associates for future leadership roles in health sciences librarianship, information science, and biomedical communications.

A master's degree in library/information science earned by August of the year of appointment is required from an A.L.A. accredited institution. U.S. citizenship may not be a requirement in all cases for the Associate Program. Candidates receive a one-year temporary Civil Service appointment at the GS-7 level (\$15,922). The program runs from September 1 through August 31.

Application deadline for the 1982/83 Associate Program is March 1, 1982. The final date for requesting applications is February 1, 1982. Interested students and graduates may write or call:

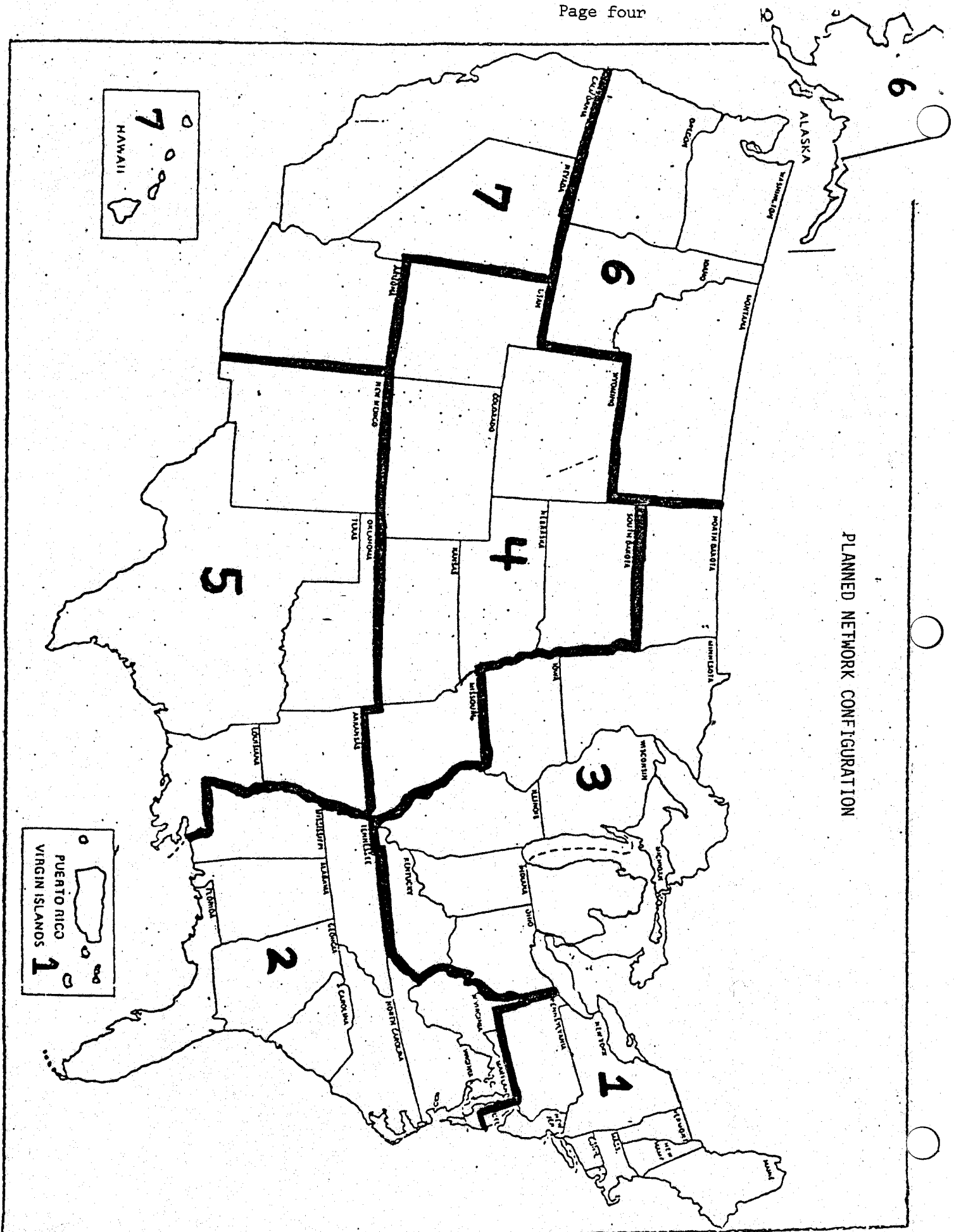
