INTERLIBRARY LOAN CHANGES-PLEASE NOTE

Beginning April 1, there will no longer be NLN funds for the referral of interlibrary loan requests to other resource libraries or for filled referrals. This means that if material is referred YOU MAY BE CHARGED BY THE LIBRARY THAT FILLS YOUR REQUEST. Some resource libraries will also be charging to refer your request to another library, thereby compounding the charges.

Middleton HSL Guidelines Until June

- 1) Charges for photocopies will remain the same and original materials will be loaned free to libraries in its primary service area.

2) There will be no charge from Middleton if MLS refers it to another library for its primary service users at this time.

3) You must indicate REFER on the top of the ILL form if you want the request referred on to another resource library, OTHERWISE THE REQUEST WILL BE RETURNED TO YOU. Be aware that you may or may not be charged for a filled referral.

4) You can also indicate REFER IF NO CHARGES. This will direct MLS to refer only if they can identify a library that does not charge. This would keep the option open to use the WILS system or any other non-charging system.

The ILL program is in the middle of a great deal of change at this moment. Middleton expects that any charges after June to Wisconsin users will be less than charges to out of state users. We will give as much advance warning as possible about new charges.

A TRIBUTE TO BESSIE STEIN

Late January of 1982 brought a bitter-sweet message to Bessie Stein's many friends and colleagues throughout Wisconsin and the Midwest as Bessie announced her retirement from the Directorship of the Medical College of Wisconsin's Todd Wehr Library.

Bessie Stein Continued

Bessie's tenure at the Library has been a long one as she moved through a variety of positions including head cataloger. She served as Acting Director in 1971 upon the retirement of long time Director Frances Beckwith and again in 1974 when Richard Eimas resigned to accept another position. To everyone's delight Bessie became the Director of what was then the Marquette Medical Library. In the following years she shepherded that library from its status as part of the Marquette University Library System to a free standing independent library in the newly formed Medical College of Wisconsin with several branches in the clinical complex which surrounds it on Watertown Plank Road.

During this fruitful period Bessie also served as chairperson of the Midwest Health Science Library Network and worked with several of its most important committees including the one responsible for the recent restructure of the region's governing body.

Bessie's many friends throughout the region will miss her level headed approach to problems, her generosity both as a person and as a resource library director, and her genuine interest in promoting the very best in health information services.

While Bessie will be uniformly missed, many of us also envy her opportunity to organize a private collection of music.

We all wish Bessie well in her new adventure in librarianship and hope that she feel free to join her WHSLA colleagues from time to time at their various gatherings.

MHSLN ASSEMBLY MEETING - FEB. 8

A large number of people were in attendance at the February 8 MHSLN Assembly meeting at the Sheraton-O'Hare in Rosemont, IL. Full representation of all resource libraries and states indicated a strong interest in the present programs of Region VII and a concern for the future of National Library of Medicine's new reconfiguration. Region VII and Region V will become Region III when the new RML contracts are awarded by October 1. South Dakota, a forthcoming member of Region III, sent observers to the meeting.

It was announced that by vote of its members, the MHSLN Council was dissolved on February 1.

RML Director, Irvin Pizer, reported on the timetable for submission of the contract proposal for the RML of the new region.

The management office solicited responses to a questionnaire from basic units, consortium coordinators, and resource libraries in both Region V and Region VII, which in the future will be Region 3. Responders from both regions were asked to rank the five most important services and programs for the new region. Any bidding library for the RML of Region III would have access to this material. He also announced that the Management Office was at full staff with the addition of Janet Corson as program Coordinator: Regional Development. Janet's present position will run from February to September 1982.

NOW IS THE TIME TO RENEW YOU WHSLA MEMBERSHIP.

Bessie Stein's resignation as Director of Todd Wehr Library was announced and gratitude was expressed for her work within the Region. Since Bessie was chair-elect of the Region, the executive committee was instructed to name a new chair-elect. At a later meeting, Glenn Brudvig of Biomedical Library, University of Minnesota was named Chair-elect of the Assembly. At that same time Eileen Emberson of Wisconsin was named to replace Patti Williams of Minnesota as a Basic Unit Representative on the executive committee. Patti has new professional responsibilities and resigned as Minnesota's Assembly Representative. Cecile Kramer of Northwestern became the new Resource Library Representative on the executive committee taking Glenn's place.

Much discussion centered on the interlibrary loan program in the next phase which will see the demise of NLM direct support to the Region. A separate article in the Newsletter focuses on the effect for the state.

The communication project on the use of micro-computers in consortium that involved the South Central Consortium here in Wisconsin was stopped. At present there is not the time nor funds to continue such a project. The Communication Committee was disbanded with thanks for their consistent investigation of the use of new communication methods for facilitation of resource sharing.

Kate Hammell, special project person for the Regional Online catalog, reported that the entire file will be mounted on March 12. Libraries with BRS service will of course have first access. The April Newsletter should indicate the method for assignment of codes of other libraries.

Many of the implementation project were discussed. The Reference Interviewing booklet should be completed by June. The Information Request Form project will be published as an Update and included with the February Resources. Consumer Satisfaction project will also be an MHSLN Update. The publication "Descriptive Statistics for Librarians" has gone through its second review and will be present at the Consortium Coordinators meeting at the end of March.

The AV Resource Directory, a catalog of publishers is now in the word processor and should be available soon. South Dakota indicated that it has 2000 titles in machine readable form. The guidelines for AV resource sharing is also progressing toward publication.

The Basic Library Management II will be available this summer. No price was given at this time. The need for the Hospital Administrators Packet was discussed at length.

Evaluation of the MEDLINE UPDATE clinic was presented, with the strong consensus of the search analysts indicating their desire to hold the fall 1982 UPDATE in conjunction with the MC/MLA in Milwaukee.

COWL NEWS

As most health science librarians in Wisconsin know, we have shared a representative to COWL (Council of Wisconsin Librarians) for the past several years. COWL began as a group of action oriented academic librarians who brought OCLC to Wisconsin and formed and developed WILS (the Wisconsin Interloan Service). When it became obvious that its services were going to be used by many types of libraries. COWL expanded its membership to include representation from other types of libraries in addition to academics. Originally WHSLA shared a representative with the Wisconsin SLA and ASIS organizations.

At its December meeting COWL made some changes to its Bylaws, which are especially significant to health science libraries. First, it changed its name to Council of Wisconsin Libraries since representation is linked to specific libraries or types of libraries whenever possible rather than to individuals working in libraries. Secondly, it provided for one member from the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network rather than one shared by WHSLA, Wisconsin SLA and Wisconsin ASIS. (They were not aware of the name change for that body). From now on, health science libraries will have a representative of their own rather than sharing one. This representative will be chosen by the Network rather than by WHSLA since the network represents libraries rather than individuals.

These Bylaw changes go into effect July 1, 1982. In the meanwhile Kathy Schneider, Executive Director of COWL has asked Virginia Holtz to informally represent the interest of WHSLN. The Network should select a representative by July 1st.

REPORT OF FEBRUARY 5 MEETING

On February 5th COWL met in Madison at the Howard Johnson's on University Ave. An important guest speaker was Paul Norton of the Wisconsin Educational Communications Board who spoke and answered questions about the Multistate Telecommunication Project. This is a three phase project which is to examine how state-of-the-art technologies could be employed in a multi-state telecommunications network, design a network which meets the needs of the various states, and implement the project. The group is now working on phase two. The states initially involved were Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin, and other states have since expressed interest in joining.

Though implementation of this project is some years down the road it is well worth the attention of all libraries, since such a network would provide us all with the essential communications links we need in order to effectively share resources. Anyone who has been frustrated by slow mail deliveries, experiences with facsimile transmitters, also slow or inadequate hook-ups for educational sessions will welcome the development of an all purpose communications network. During the meeting, COWL expressed to Mr. Norton a strong interest in being represented on any group providing feedback to this project, and initial links between COWL and the project were forged. Mr. Norton was clearly convinced that libraries are heavy potential users of such a system.

Several members of the COWL staff reported on meetings attended. Items of special interest included ADONIS;

a consortium of publishers who intend to offer a document delivery service. They would store journals (after production in hard copy) on digital-optical disks and provide copies of articles on demand at \$7.00 to \$15.00. They received feedback from the librarians present about the relative costs of the same services from such networks as WILS and MINNITEX, and suggestions about selling the disks themselves to libraries with space problems.

WHSLA CONTINUING EDUCATION SURVEY REPORT

Thirty eight responses to the WHSLA Continuing Education Survey were received by the final deadline of December 1, 1981, representing 29% of our membership. This survey, as published in the August newsletter, was planned to assist the Continuing Education Committee and Program Committees in educational programming through 1983. Input was solicited regarding MLA CE courses, workshops in conjunction with WHSLA meetings, ETN programming, and other ways of meeting the continuing education needs of WHSLA members. A report of the results in each of these areas follows.

MLA Continuing Education Courses

Interest in MLA courses is strong. The ten most popular MLA course listed on the survey are listed below in order of popularity:

- Literature of Health Care Administration (16 votes)
- Patient Education (14 votes)
- Library Management/Planning (11 votes)
- Clinical Librarianship (11 votes)
- Literature of Allied Health (11 votes)
- MeSH and NLM Classification (10 votes)
- Library Management/Marketing (10 votes)
- Basic Budgeting for Health Sciences Libraries (10)
- Planning/Operational and Strategic (10 votes)
- Information Resources in Clinical Medicine (10 votes)

We also asked members to indicate their top three choices. First choices were given three points, second choices two, and third choices one point. Using this weighted system, the top five choices were as follows:

- Literature of Health Care Administration (16 points, 7 members)
- MeSH and NLM Classification (14 points, 6 members)
- Planning/Operational and Strategic (11 points, 6 members)
- Systems Analysis (10 points, 4 members)
- Patient Education (9 points, 7 members)

Eliminating the choices of those members preferring half-day courses did not significantly change the rankings. The survey gives us a good sampling of members' course preferences. Unfortunately, it was based on courses listings supplied by MLA in June, 1981, which were changed per the revision published in the September, 1981 MLA News. Three of our top choices - Literature of Health Care Administration and both planning courses - are not currently available.

Other Courses

Half-day courses have been offered in conjunction with WHSLA meetings. 16 members prefer this option (two of these said this choice should be available), 14 do not, and 8 did not respond. Those preferring this option listed many topics - most

Similar to the popular MLA course topics. Other ideas were microcomputer, basic Medline, listing serial holdings to conform to guidelines, time management, writing skills, and decision making.

ETN Programming

Ideas were solicited for the annual ETN Health Science Library Seminars series - unfortunately the wrong year was indicated. Again, many of the topics were similar to the MLA course preferences. Additional ideas were:

- Making the most of shrinking space and budgets
- Word processing applications in libraries
- Medical terminology for specific disciplines
- Network issues
- Mental health literature/services
- Department/Unit library management
- Service measurement - Quantity and Quality
- Update on Online Regional Monograph Catalog
- MEDLARS III
- Communicating with users
- Library legislation/lobbying
- Holistic Medicine: Reality or New Quackery?
- Library's role as a teaching institution
- Library instruction for health care professionals on reprint file management

Other ways of meeting continuing education needs

The Continuing Education Committee has a special charge this year to consider ways, other than the Annual Meeting, for meeting the educational needs of the membership. Ideas listed on survey responses include the following:

- Medline tips and/or users group for search analysts with 2-4 hours of monthly search time
- Publication of short papers by members in the newsletter
- Certification examination preparation
- Loan audiovisuals on librarianship
- Educational sessions at consortia meetings

The Continuing Education Committee plans to meet March 19, 1982 to consider this charge and discuss educational needs assessment and planning for our membership. Please direct your reaction to these ideas, and/or any additional ideas, to a committee member prior to that meeting.
