MC/MLA MILWAUKEE MEETING

The schedule follows the traditional format of MC/MLA with continuing education courses being offered Thursday. The program part of the meeting will be Friday through Saturday noon. This year persons will have the opportunity of taking either MLA Continuing Education courses, half day courses, or a course offered by BRS on Thursday. The keynote speaker will be Barbara Evans Markuson of the Indiana Cooperative Library Services Authority, Indianapolis, Indiana.

A tour and buffet at the Miller Brewery heads the list of special events.

MEDLINE UPDATE CLINIC - OCTOBER 6-7

The Annual MEDLINE Update Clinic will be held preceding and on the continuing education day of MC/MLA. The Clinic will also be held at the Pfister Hotel. This will allow participants to attend two meetings in one trip. This is a welcome addition for searchers on the present-day limited budgets. ETN PROGRAMS FOR THE YEAR

A51 Basic Management for Health Sciences Librarians

This long-standing course is returning after a year's rest. It is designed for new managers, librarians

and other interested people who want an introduction to health sciences librarianship. Registration at this time is low and there must be 20 people enrolled for UW-Extension to offer the course. The opening session will be Monday, October 11 at 10:00 AM.

Seminars for Health Sciences Librarians

The program and registration form for the series is included with this Newsletter. We are appreciative of the Medical School and UW-Extension Allied Health Division's assistance in keeping this a low cost continuing education program. MLA-CE's are awarded for full attendance at these seminars.

ETN MLA Continuing Education Course

Another MLA Continuing Education course will be offered beginning February 10, meeting weekly into March on the Education Telephone Network. Because of the positive evaluation of the Neoplasia course presented this past spring, a decision has been made to offer another similar course in format, MLA CE 464-81 - Online Searching in Psychiatry. This course will also be offered at MLA/MC, but with the wide variety of choices available for Thursday a second scheduling of the course for Wisconsin people may make decisions easier.

REGIONAL MONOGRAPH CATALOG

July gave to the Midwest Health Sciences Library Network the opportunity to access the new regional monograph data base. All MEDLINE centers in the Region were invited to attend the BRS training session and introduction to the interlibrary loan module of the Data Base in Chicago, June 28-30. A number of people responded and are now using the Data Base to search monograph holdings and then transmitting requests via the ILL module.

Currently the Regional Online Monograph Catalog contains the holdings of the thirteen Resource Libraries of the Region and Rockford Memorial Hospital, Rockford. Holdings date from 1976 and there are currently 60,000 volumes in the Data Base.

Much credit for the development of the Data Base must go to Irvin Pizer, RML Director, and Project Director of the NLM contract. The negotiations with NLM and BRS were arduous in light of the current federal budget situation. Kate Hamill is serving as project coordinator.

The current free access to BRS for use of the Data Base is covered by the contract and extends until December 1982. The future status of the project will not be known until the Regional contract is in the renegotiation period.

COLAND WORKS ON LEGISLATIVE MANDATE

The Council on Libraries and Network Development is now working on two legislative mandates that affect health sciences libraries. These studies with recommendations are to be completed by the end of the year.

One committee is to look at the "desirability of providing state aids to medical libraries in hospitals and health care institutions and to public library system resource libraries and make recommendations to the state superintendent of public instruction". Betsy Merriam is serving as the DLS liaison. Mary Camfield and Barbara Schmiechen are representing the health sciences libraries at those meetings. CWHSLN members provided much helpful feedback at the May Council meeting in determining priorities for state involvement. The work of this committee will be completed by October. The final meeting will be held August 19 in Madison.

The second committee's responsibility is to "study funding for state level library information resource providers and make recommendations to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The Council shall make its recommendations and the State Superintendent shall transmit the recommendations to the Governor and Legislature by December 31, 1982". The initial meeting for this subcommittee was August 12. Virginia Holtz and Barbara Schmiechen represented the Health Sciences Library Network. Other state level resource providers present were Reference and Loan, WILS, State Historical Society Library, State Law Library, and Wisconsin Dissemination Project.

STATE CONSULTANTS GUIDELINES

The guidelines for the Wisconsin consultancy program are printed for your information. Final approval for the Guidelines was given by the Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network at its May meeting. A formal application for persons interested in participating in the program will be included in the October Newsletter.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR


Dear Editor:

ROLE STATEMENT FOR WISCONSIN HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARY CONSULTANTS

Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Consultation Program under the auspices of the Council of the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network will include two levels of consultation through consortium consultants and on-site consultants.

There will be in each consortium a consultant who will be available to respond to queries of library managers or librarians dealing with library management issues; local, state, or national network issues; and continuing education issues. This person will respond to telephone or mail queries only. A consortium coordinator may or may not be the consultant for her/his consortium area. Criteria and method of selection of the consortium consultant will be established through consortium guidelines or bylaws.

The on-site health sciences library consultant serves as advisor to the hospital administration, medical staff, library staff, library committee, or any other host group in defining and designing health sciences library services and/or facilities to meet the informational, educational, research, and patient care related needs of the entire host community including, where appropriate, the instructional needs of patients. This consultant service can be provided on a contractual basis, but this may vary with the consultant's institutional policy.

At either level of consultancy, a health sciences library consultant is not a substitute for the employment of permanent library personnel.

I. Qualifications for Health Sciences Library Consultants.

A health sciences library consultant should have a master's degree in library science, and should have at least three years of health science library experience. If the consultant does not have all of the above qualifications she/he should have an equivalent combination of training and experience such as five years of health science library experience including at least three years of health sciences library management, or working with health sciences libraries in a consultative capacity.

The consultant should demonstrate good communication skills. She/he should have the ability to provide assistance on personnel, fiscal, and supervisory issues. The health sciences library consultant must show evidence of regular participation in continuing education courses in consulting, management, health sciences/hospital

librarianship such as those sponsored by the Medical Library Association or Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Association. Membership in the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Association is strongly recommended. Membership in the Medical Library Association is desirable.

The consultant must be familiar with existing national, state, and local library networks, and have a working knowledge of the National Library of Medicine's Regional Medical Library Program. The consultant should also have a thorough working knowledge of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospital's (JCAH) standards and other hospital library standards.

II. Functions/Process for On-site Health Sciences Library Consultants.

- A. Identify objectives of the consultancy with the proper administrator, library staff and/or library committee and other appropriate personnel.
- B. Negotiate a contractual agreement with the proper administrator following the policies of the consultant's home institution which would include:

- Purpose of consultation
- Consultant and client responsibilities
- Period of contract
- Number and frequency of visits or amount of time to be spent by consultant during the contractual period
- Evaluation mechanism
- Verbal and written reporting mechanisms
- Fee for service
- Terms of termination by either party

C. Conduct a needs assessment of library services, profiling all disciplines in the total organization environment. Evaluate the following functional activities.

1. Place of the library within the organization
2. Administration of the library
 - Policies and procedures
 - Library personnel management
 - Budget
 - Program planning
 - Facility planning and/or space allocation
3. Library services
 - Promoting library services
 - Answering reference questions and providing bibliographic information
 - Meeting the specific subject information needs of the staff
 - Audiovisual services
 - Cooperation with other libraries
 - Patient education
 - Methods of evaluating library services
4. Collection development and control
 - Circulation or control of materials
 - Assessment of collection materials in relation to the service areas of the hospital or organization
 - Acquiring, cataloging, arranging, organizing and evaluating library materials.

D. Provide specific written recommendations for the administrator, library manager/librarian and/or library committee.

E. Develop a methodology for implementation of recommendations by employee(s) assigned to the library. Include a timeable as part of these recommendations.

- F. Evaluate and assess progress regularly during the contractual period.
 - Develop a reporting mechanism for evaluation and assessment.

III. Recommendations for the Documentation of Consultative Visits.

The health sciences library consultant shall document each visit. At minimum such documentation should include:

- A record of the date, length of visit, and persons involved in discussion
- An account of the consultant's activities during each visit
- Recommendations for action based on the needs assessment
- Progress reports
- Suggestions for follow-up

A record of documented visits shall be maintained on file for review by the appropriate reviewing staff, and/or library committee. Meetings with the administrator, library manager, and library committee to discuss recommendations, questions or concerns should be held as needed and followed by a formal written report. A copy of the written report should also be on file at the site of the state registry. (See next section) The consortium consultant should document her/his phone or mail consulting activities and those records should be maintained in her/his own office.

IV. Methods of Identifying Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Consultants.

1. A special committee shall be formed by the Council of the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Network to develop a state consultant registry or list utilizing the criteria to screen applicants. This committee shall make recommendations to be approved by the Council. Information in the Registry must be updated annually by the consultants.
2. The criteria should be published in the WHSLA Newsletter, the Wisconsin Medical Journal, WHA Newsletter and other related hospital or health journals.
3. A brochure and advertisements should be developed which define the criteria for consultants and identify source of further information for institutions seeking consultants. They should be distributed to the above mentioned journals and/or their sponsoring organizations.
4. The Medical Library Association shall be informed of the Wisconsin consultants who meet the national qualifications.
