Meetings of both the WHSLA Board and the Council of Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network will be held on those days. Several important issues will be discussed at the Council Meeting and anyone is welcome to attend the meeting.

ONLINE USERS SUBCOMMITTEE

The Online Users Subcommittee of the WHSLA Continuing Education Committee met February 8, 1983 in Madison. Members of the sub-committee are Jackie Glick, Chair, Mary Blackwelder, Vicki Schluge, Margaret Warpinski and Barbara Schmiechen, ETN Liaison. The results of the Online Users Interest Survey were discussed and programs for next (1983/4) year formulated. We were most gratified by the 70% participation, and want to thank you all for your cooperation.

It is too late to try to arrange a program in conjunction with the April 1983 annual meeting of WHSLA, so we have concentrated on the 1983/1984 year. We have decided to propose to ETN a course of two, two-hour sessions, one in the Fall, November 1983, and one in the Spring, February 1984. Each session will review databases in a given topic, and will be followed by a search strategy clinic on that topic. Specific search questions will be formulated and sent to registrants together with relevant material for the discussion, before the course. For the Fall session the topic will be the drug related databases. Ruth Swanson of the Clinical Sciences Library, UW-Madison, has agreed to conduct this session. The Spring session topic will be management related databases. Meg Panzarella of Northwestern University will undertake the session. We are working on a program to be presented in conjunction with the annual 1984 WHSLA meeting. One of the possibilities which has been suggested to us was to see if we can obtain videotapes of the annual MESH indexers update with Thelma Charin, and the individual database instruction sessions. We shall try and keep you informed through this newsletter.

LEGISLATIVE CONCERNS

In 1981, Elsevier and Excerpta Medica lobbied for a full cost recovery amendment (Hatch amendment for NLM's services. This amendment was attached to S800, the senate bill to reauthorize the Medical Library Assistance Act. Although the amendment did not pass at that time, Elsevier has continued to present its case to members of congress. Excerpta Medica's arguments may be very convincing to congressional staff who are struggling with federal spending issues.

Below are excerpts of a December 1982 letter from Excerpta Medica concerning full cost recovery for NLM's services to for-profit libraries and information services. Supposedly this letter was sent to all directors of academic health science libraries.

Excerpta Medica's position

"...Excerpta Medica has consistently applauded and supported the NLM's important role as the world's pre-eminent biomedical information repository. Unfortunately, the NLM has chosen to subsidize commercial companies using its MEDLARS bibliographic retrieval services by NLM charging fees to commercial users that do not recover the full, actual costs of MEDLARS. I must stress that Excerpta Medica has never argued for full cost recovery of the MEDLARS system for non-commercial and other non-profit entities... in fact, if our proposals are fully enacted, it is conceivable that the fees generated would result in additional funding to the non-profit sector. Why is NLM subsidizing profitable companies, including chemical and oil companies, to the exact same extent that it subsidizes libraries, medical schools, non-profit hospitals and research institutes... It is anathema to the public interest to allow any producer to persistently sell a product to commercial users at below-cost rates since it will then become the sole provider of that product..."

NLM's position

NLM, backed by MLA, has argued that its practice of subsidizing all users of MEDLARS is justified. Background information on NLM's position is well presented in Gloria Werner's editorial in the April 1982 Bulletin of the Medical Library Association, p. 244-5 and the "Capitol Notes" column on the GAO study of MEDLARS in the September 1982 issue of MLA News. The following is an overview of NLM's position as outlined in these two publications.

The National Library of Medicine Act of 1956 directs the library to acquire books, periodicals, and other materials; to organize them by cataloging or indexing; and to publish and make available the information contained in these materials. The fundamental rationale for NLM's legislated mission recognizes that 1) health is a national priority 2) health research is a major national investment 3) dissemination of information derived from this health research is essential to realize the full benefit from the investment in the research and 4) all possible means should be taken to effectively disseminate this information. The legislative mandate of NLM is to provide the means for assuring ready dissemination of health research results. Database creation costs should be viewed as part of this mandate. This legislated mission is already supported by tax dollars, both private and public.

NLM feels that access or reproduction costs only should be passed on to users. Cost of MEDLARS database creation, including purchase of materials, indexing and related computer costs should be viewed as an integral part of NLM's legislated mandate. On-line users of MEDLARS (public or private) now pay charges approximating only those of full access to the system. It can be argued that U.S. private corporations have supported a share of the database creation costs through tax dollars and should be allowed to lease tapes at the cost of reproduction. Excerpta Medica feels that NLM should recover full costs, not just access costs, from certain profit

making entities, and that exempt non-profit users would not be allowed to provide service to these for-profit agencies. Aside from the legality of this requirement, NLM feels it would be very difficult and costly to control and administer.

What other vendors think

Another view, that of database vendors leasing MEDLARS tapes, is that NLM should charge them also only the costs of reproducing the tapes. At present, these vendors may be paying more than the actual costs of reproduction.

Perhaps it is in this area that some policies may need to be revised.

GAO study

The General Accounting Office, as requested by Senator Hatch, studied NLM's pricing and provision of information services. The GAO concluded from its study that NLM's present policy of charging all health-related users, profit or non-profit, only the costs of access to its online databases is generally consistent with existing statutes and regulations.

What does this mean for us

Although this issue has not yet resurfaced in the new 98th Congress, it is likely that it will be brought up again. The Legislative Committee will keep you informed as to the committee members and the latest developments.

In the meantime, please read the two articles cited above and form an opinion on the issue. Then please write to Excerpta Medica and your congressmen letting them know your opinion.

NEW DIRECTIONS AND CONSORTIA

A variety of speakers and subjects relating to individual libraries and to consortia created the program for "New directions and consortia" held in Indianapolis, March 24-25.

Microcomputers, leadership development, and economic issues were addressed most often throughout the day and a half meeting. Another important part of the meeting was an identification of ways the new Region could assist consortia. The results to be assimilated by the Management Office.

Economic issues were the main undercurrent of much of the discussion both within the program and in informal conversations. The fiscal impact of one situation included the decision of the parent institution to create an independent subsidiary. This would be comprised of the media center and library which is expected to recover full costs of their operations. Other issues include the charging of fees for consortium membership which are used for union lists and continuing education; very formal arrangements for shared acquisition of serials projects; the use of microcomputers to send interlibrary loans in a metropolitan consortium; and the growth of the circuit rider librarian programs.

It is my feeling that diverse models are needed to look at various methods of meeting the needs of health care providers within each of our settings, but as a network of libraries in the State, we must also address the underserved area and look for examples of structures that might assist consortia in their attempt to remain viable. This meeting just began to offer that—more work in this area is needed.

LIBRARY NOTES

Epilepsyline

EPILEPSYLINE which was formerly part of the MEDLARS system is now being carried by BRS. The label is EPIL and covers 1945 to date. This data base is a product of The National Institute of Neurological and Communicative Disorders and Stroke (NICDS).

MMWR

The Center for Disease Control has long provided an important service to health care providers through MMWR (Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report). At one time they were distributing 110,000 free copies. Current governmental funding cuts had forced them to cut the list back to 10,000 and charging \$75.00 a year for a subscription. Because of this JAMA is now abstracting MMWR, and New England Journal of Medicine is taking over publication of the journal at a lower subscription price than CDC.

HOUSING FOR CONFERENCES

It has been suggested that the Newsletter serve as a clearinghouse for housing at various health sciences conferences across the country. With the reduced travel budgets and increased hotel prices, housing becomes a major expenditure that can be reduced if rooms are shared.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Medical Library Assistance Act

The Waxman Committee has recommended a three year renewal of \$10, 11, and 12 million for FY 84-86. Medical Library Association had recommended \$12, 13 and 14 million, but the lower levels were expected. The FY 83 funding is at 7.5 million.

Conditions of Participation for Medicare

There has been no word on the guidelines for participation. The deadline for guideline comments came at almost the same time that Richard Schweiker resigned and Margaret Heckler was appointed as his successor. It is never very clear when final decisions are made when guidelines revisions are proposed.

NEWSLETTER ADDRESS WEEDING

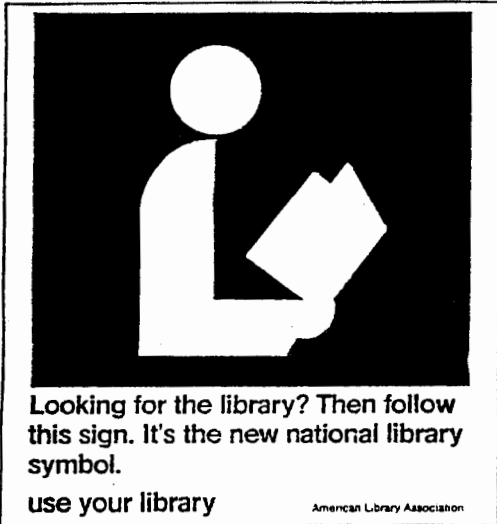
After the mailing of the April Newsletter the address list for the Newsletter will undergo an extensive weeding. Beginning with the May Newsletter the following groups will be on the address list-
