WHSLA ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES

The Seventh Annual Meeting of the Wisconsin Health Science Library Association was called to order by President Anne Taylor at 12:30 p.m. on April 29, 1983 at the Holiday Inn in LaCrosse. Forty-eight people were present.

The minutes of the Sixth Annual Meeting were approved as read.

Larry Jacobson read the Treasurer's Report. The Association's bank balance as of April 13, 1983 was \$6,618.10. He anticipates that after the annual meeting expenses have been paid the balance will be reduced to approximately \$4,000.00 to \$4,500.00. He suggested that the Association investigate the possibility of investing in an interest producing account.

Larry Jacobson also reported that the Association membership rose from 112 to 127. The membership committee developed a packet of materials for new members, and a brochure describing the organization. They also recommended to the board that membership renewals be tied in with the calendar year. Larry announced that Pat Craven has accepted an appointment as Treasurer and Membership Chairman for the coming year.

Jean Hawkins reported for the Bylaw Committee. The Committee recommended changes in the bylaws to mesh time schedules with Association activities. Changes will be sent to the membership for a mail vote. Jean motioned that the Association implement the changes prior to receiving the results of the vote. The motion was seconded by Deb Hall and passed unanimously.

Peg Allen reported on the Continuing Education Committee. Barbara Schmiechen completed the education needs assessment of the membership. Next year ETN programs will be based on the assessment. Peg Allen also reported on the proposed annual WHSLA Monograph. If it is going to be successful the membership will have to contribute articles. Jackie Glick is working on having an online training session included with the next annual meeting. The Online Users Subcommittee is developing two search strategy clinics to be presented on the ETN network next November and February.

Mary Blackwelder reported for the Legislation Committee. The committee has concentrated on keeping the membership informed on the proposed changes in the Medicare and Medicaid requirements concerning hospital libraries and the full cost issue between Excerpta Medica and NLM. Chapter 43 of the Wisconsin Statutes, dealing with libraries, is being rewritten. The Committee will keep the membership informed of the progress of the revision.

Neil Hootkin reported for the Election Committee. Eighty-eight (88) ballots were returned. Sharon Hoepfer was elected President-Elect. The newly-elected Representatives-At-Large were announced:

MaVerne Samb reported for the Program Committee. There were 49 registrants for the meeting. Special thanks were extended to American Bindery, Login Bros., and Fennell Subscription for the Thursday evening social hour and the refreshments for the breaks.

The 1984 Annual Meeting will be hosted by the Fox River Valley Area Cooperative in Appleton on April 26 and 27. The 1985 Annual Meeting will be hosted by the Northern Wisconsin Health Science Area Cooperative and will be held in Stevens Point.

The Executive Board voted to have the WHSLA Newsletter published twelve times a year.

Barbara Schmiechen made an announcement for the WHSLA Council. Last fall the Council voted to apply for a grant from the Council of Wisconsin Libraries (COWL) to provide for a serials location listing. Joy Shong wrote the grant application and the grant was awarded to us for OCLC time. Under the terms of the grant, we would have to fund the imputing of the holdings, as well as the end product. The recent refiguration of the region has made our Council more aware of the University of Louisville serial listing service, which is readily available and economically feasible. The Council voted to proceed with a State Serial list through the University of Louisville KOM system as quickly as possible. The COWL grant will not be abandoned for it provides access to state multitype sharing. Announcements regarding this project will appear in future issues of the WHSLA Newsletter.

Anne Taylor commented on recent disturbing news of concern to librarians. The Suggested Minimum Guidelines for Health Science Libraries published by MHSLN as part of the Packet to Administrators is extremely weak and disappointing. The proposed lowering of Federal Government standards, the downgrading of entry level librarians, and the contracting out of services could have a sifting down effect on non-federal librarians.

Eileen Emberson announced and distributed registration literature for the upcoming Minnesota Health Science Library Association seminar featuring Lois Ann Colaianni.

Peg Allen will be contacting the membership to serve on committees.

The meeting adjourned at 1:15 p.m.

MLA SALARY SURVEY

The May 1983 MLA News contained the initial results of the MLA Salary Survey. 2,731 responses were received from the approximate 4,400 questionnaires mailed for a 63.4% return rate. The currently published tables include geographic area, sex, race, type of institution served, and primary area of responsibility. Later this year various other tables and analyses will be published.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Lucille Stark, Chair of the MLA Legislative Committee reports several items of interest in her latest memo to committee members.

MLAA News

The Medical Library Assistance Act is currently pending before the full Energy and Commerce Committee (H.R. 2350). There has been no final deposition. In the Senate S. 773 has currently been ordered to be reported out as amended by the Labor and Human Resources Committee. This is unofficial and it will go to the floor when it becomes official. Many budget items are caught between three different budgets of the House, Senate and White House.

Conditions for Medicare Reimbursement

There was an overwhelming response on the part of the medical librarians and health care providers to the proposed revised guidelines in regard to the deletion of the requirement of a medical library for conditions of participation in Medicare/Medicaid. There is no word of any revised guidelines at this time.

Exerpta Medica and NLM
