WHSLA Online Searchers - ETN. A new program designed by the Online Users subcommittee of The Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Association provides an opportunity for intensive work on data bases in certain subject areas. #### General Health Sciences Library Courses

All fall MC/MLA, Medline Clinics, and other conferences offer MLA-CE's. In additions to these regional opportunities, our own programs are available once again.

### NLM ITEMS

#### NLM To Begin ILL Charges in October

Effective October 1, 1983, the National Library of Medicine will charge domestic libraries \$5 and foreign libraries \$7 for each interlibrary loan filled by NLM. This change in policy reflects the philosophy within the Federal Government of establishing fees for services and of encouraging the development of regional and local resources. The change also brings NLM practice into conformity with Resource and Regional Medical Libraries in NLM's Regional Medical Library Network.

The \$5 charge to domestic libraries will be a standard fee for the provision of photocopy of a journal article or for loan of a monograph or videocassette. There will be no charge for loan requests which are not filled. Federal libraries are not charged for loans filled by NLM. The \$7 charge to foreign libraries is the fee for providing a photocopy of a journal article. Material in the original form is not loaned outside the United States. Fees include charges for handling and postage.

Requesters are urged to establish deposit accounts with the National Technical Information Service, which will serve as a collection agent for fees. Invoices will be issued quarterly beginning in January 1984.

A new NLM "Interlibrary Loan Policy" will be released shortly, it will be included in the next Newsletter.

ASSESSING LIBRARY QUALITY

A "Manual for Assessing the Quality of Health Sciences Libraries in Hospitals" has recently been published by the New York State Library. It is intended to assist hospital administrators, librarians, and others in assessing library services and measuring the improvement of those services. This pioneering document should be useful for other kinds of health sciences libraries and could serve as a model in other areas of library service as well.

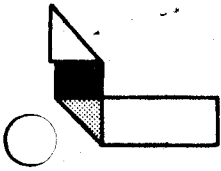

### TOWARD CINCINNATI IN SEPTEMBER

"Toward 1984," the annual meeting of the Midwest Chapter of the Medical Library Association will be held in Cincinnati, September 25-27. Drawing on Orwell's 1984 concept that people are at the mercy of a purpose over which they have no control, we will investigate the opportunities to change the imperfection we find around us.

A diverse and exciting slate of speakers awaits you. Our keynote speakers are three: Richard Boss, Senior Management Consultant with Information Systems Consultants of Bethesda, Maryland, is a specialist in library automation, database development, telefacsimile and videodisc technology; Estelle Brodman will help link our regional conference to that of the 1983 MLA annual meeting, the theme of which is "The Pursuit of Excellence"; and a special guest appearance will also be made by George Orwell himself.

The program will run on three tracks:

Library/Technical - exploring marketing, telecommunications, advertising, history of medicine, collection preservation, and censorship;

Futuristic - exploring financial past and future, budgeting, computers, microcomputers, and the acceptance of new ideas;

Organizational/Management - exploring the politics affecting libraries, personnel management, motivation, and interpersonal relationships.

Over twenty speakers will be featured including the following: George Cunha, conservation specialist; John C. Swan, expert on intellectual freedom and censorship; Bob Braude, providing an overview of the impact of the AAMC study; and Nancy Lorenzi, 1982-83 MLA President. Hospital administrators and librarians will discuss financial and organizational issues facing hospital libraries. Two contributed paper sessions will feature papers on topics of current interest prepared by our colleagues. One module will be devoted to vendors representing specific new technologies such as electronic journal publishing.

A look at scenic Cincinnati via chartered bus is planned for Sunday afternoon with a stop atop Mt. Adams at Krohn Conservatory, our city's beautiful indoor botanical gardens. Sunday evening's cocktail party will enable you to leisurely enjoy the opening of the exhibits while visiting with colleagues. The film, "1984," will be shown Sunday evening to whet your appetite and to put you in the mood for the stimulating program we have planned. For baseball fans, the Cincinnati Reds will be playing host to the San Diego Padres and the Los Angeles Dodgers during our meeting.

On Monday evening we will board the riverboat, "Betty Blake," for a fun-filled evening of music and fine food.

The annual MC/MLA business meeting will follow Tuesday's luncheon and special guest speaker, Dr. Benjamin Felson, Professor, University of Cincinnati College of Medicine.

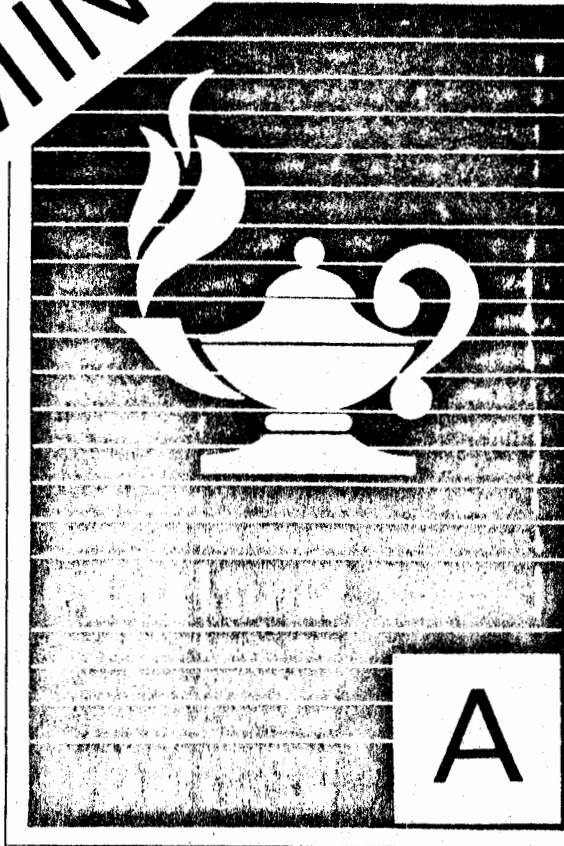
