The course will be held on Thursdays beginning March 8 and continuing for three consecutive weeks at 10:00-11:50. This course has recently been revised.

Valerie Florance, Documents Librarian and Editor of MEDOC at Eccles Health Sciences Library, University of Utah, will serve as the instructor for the course. Ms. Florance has recently published an article in Information Hotline, "Government Publishing and the Reagan Administration: An Analysis of Trends".

The Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health is making changes in its 1984 index. Its long awaited accessibility via online searching will take place this year. It will be available both on BRS and Dialog. Other changes will be the subject indexing of new books in nursing and allied health. This feature takes the place of the book review section which their research reveals had not been used regularly. Both the AV and pamphlet section will be dropped.

CINAHL has updated its subject headings to coordinate with MeSH. Additional headings have been added to refine the searching in the nursing literature. They have also redesigned the MeSH trees to include more nursing terms.
