Planning

Does WHSLA need a Planning Committee? This question has been posed to the Board via an informal survey. Most board members believe that planning is their responsibility, with a Board subcommittee seen as the most effective mechanism for planning. As part of planning, this subcommittee could coordinate surveys of members, so that we can get a good response rate by not oversurveying the membership. Two areas worth surveying later this year are continuing education needs and interests for 1985 and beyond, and our beliefs about legislative issues. Regarding state legislative planning, we testified at hearings last fall (see September - October newsletters). Herbert Grover, State Superintendent of Education, has shared his views on interlibrary cooperation and resource sharing in the December 1983, Channel DLS. This is must

reading, and WHSLA should respond. (If you do not receive Channel DLS, call Betsy Merriam to get your library on the state mailing list) Mary Campfield, (a Task Force Member) says we can wait until after the Annual Meeting to respond, in order to get member input. A membership survey, such as the one WLA has sent its' members, might be the best indicator of member opinion, and wouldn't limit us to the views of those who can attend the Annual Meeting.

SIDS CENTER INFORMATION

The Wisconsin SIDS Center is a statewide agency that provides counseling, education and information on Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, also known as SIDS or crib death, to parents who have experienced SIDS and other individuals who may encounter SIDS families.

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the sudden death of an infant or young child, unexpected by history, in which a thorough postmortem examination confirms the diagnosis of SIDS and establishes that no previously unsuspected abnormality or other disease was present. SIDS is the leading cause of death in infants between the ages of one week and 12 months. The great majority of SIDS deaths occur in infants under six months of age. Annually in the U.S., between 6,000 and 7,000 infants die of SIDS. Wisconsin experiences SIDS at the national rate of approximately two deaths per 1,000 live births. The first symptom of SIDS is death. It is not suffocation, aspiration, regurgitation or neglect. To date, SIDS cannot be predicted or prevented. SIDS is not hereditary and occurs in all races, religions, and nationalities and may occur under anyone's care.

The Wisconsin SIDS Center offers many free services to the general public:

- . articles and pamphlets about SIDS and related issues
- . six different films on SIDS and death and dying

- . a lending library of books on life, death and grief
- . speakers for community organizations, clubs and schools
- . information and/or professional consultation to concerned individuals or groups
