A51 Basic Management for Health Sciences Librarians.

This course is now being offered every other year and that cycle places A51 into the 1984-85 program year. The ETN network is used to transmit the course that meets every other week. It will begin October 8 and continue for 12 sessions. This is a basic course designed for people new to library management and specifically to health sciences library management. The text will be Basic Management for Health Sciences Librarians, 2nd edition.

MC/MLA. October 25-27 will bring this annual regional meeting to the western side of the Midwest Region when MC/MLA meets in Cedar Rapids, IA. This meeting will offer a combination of continuing education courses, full meeting sessions, and social activities. Registration forms will be sent to MC/MLA members in late summer. MARY CAMPFIELD NAMED TO COLAND

Governor Anthony Earl named Mary Campfield as one of the appointees to the Council on Library and Network Development. This is the first time in the history of COLAND that a person from health sciences libraries and more generally special libraries has been appointed. COLAND is an advisory council to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Our congratulations to Mary on the appointment and our appreciation to Governor Earl for recognizing the need for diverse segment of the library field to be represented on COLAND.

ETN SITES

Many people have asked about the location of Educational Telephone Network participation sites. Because there are so many it is impossible to list them in the Newsletter. Every county has a site, most often in a library or court house. Many hospitals also have contracts to have an ETN site located in the hospital. Please contact Barbara Schmiechen if you would like to know the ETN site closest to you so that you can participate in one or more of the ETN's offered to you.

REPORT FROM THE GMRMLN REGIONAL COUNCIL REP.

I just received some information from the Management Office:

- Search analysts who are interested in training end users are encouraged to apply for the trainer's course. An application is enclosed with this Newsletter. The Management Office will be sending NLM a letter requesting that a training session for trainers be held in Chicago.
- An interlibrary loan cost study will be conducted October 1-31 by NLM. All Resource Libraries and 270 Basic Health Science Libraries in Region 3 will be included. The Management Office will notify each basic unit library to be included.
- AVline is to be available in late 1984 in the MARC format. Holdings for AV serial titles can be added to SERHOLD.
- If your AV staff knows of any health science related titles that are not in AVline or Health Science Audiovisuals please notify the Management Office by November 1, 1984.
- Resource Library holdings on the 1983 SERHOLD microfiche will be added to the GMRMLN ULS, 2nd issue, 1984.

- In July 1984, 25,000 ceased titles for which bibliographic data is in CATLINE will be added to SERHOLD. If your Serials staff identifies any titles not held by NLM, please notify the Management Office by January 1, 1985.

- Access to NLM for document delivery via OnTyme II and Easylink electronic mail systems will be expanded to all regions while DOCLINE is being implemented. The Management Office will contact libraries to invite their participation.

- Enclosed is an application sheet for a group rate for the ONLINE '84 conference to be held Oct. 29-31, 1984, in San Francisco. The rate is \$175 per person, a \$100 savings over the individual rate.

- The results of the survey sent to the GMRMLN consortium coordinators on the feasibility of adding basic unit holdings to the GMRMLN or SERHOLD indicates that such a list would be nice but it would not be used enough to spend a lot of extra money and energy on it. Most states are developing statewide lists that seem to fulfill their needs. The consensus of the Serials Locator Lists Committee of GMRMLN was to encourage states and local groups to produce union lists in machine readable form by using databases that end up in or by using SERHOLD or GMRMLN. LIBID's should be assigned so all libraries can take part in DOCLINE. This consensus will be reported to the Regional Council before their October meeting.

FROM OUR READERS

To The Editor:

The PEDIATRIC CLINICS OF NORTH AMERICA are peripatetic not inexpensive, and soon out-of-print. The "clinic" symposia are ideal for use by house officers and students. They unfortunately, fit handily into lab coat pockets. Their eventual return is at the whim of the gods or John Shaw Billings, whomever is least interested. Binding them had been dismissed as an unnecessary expense. The issue's covers withstand the repeated assaults of students, the book return, and photocopier. The spine lettering is now legible, and a convenient indicator of the contents.

Dean Neher of Heckman Bindery, had mentioned that at least one library binds its "clinics", austensible to save space. In a pique, I tried it. The six issues of PEDIATRIC CLINICS OF NORTH AMERICA from 1983 had once occupied some six inches of shelf...when all could be found. But, compressed to only 2 1/2 inches.

There are several advantages to binding. Each volume, regardless of which title, is consecutively paged with a cumulative index in the final number. A single set of covers makes location of page citations quicker. Separation sheets may be

inserted between the issues for reader assistance. the inner margin is sufficient to permit relatively easy copying or comfortable use of the volume by someone reading it. Shelving of a single volume is more likely to be correct, as well. The "clinics" are the site of some of the more creative interpretations of sequential numbering.

I'm binding those "clinic" titles which are more heavily used and prone to disappearance. I highly recommend the practice as a treatment for the ills of chronic "clinic" spread, whether on the shelf or from the collection.

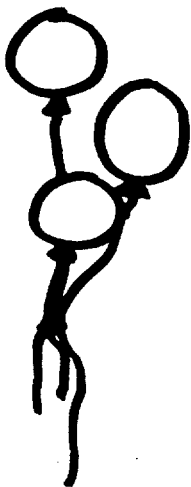
