# CWHSLN MEETING HELD SEPTEMBER 14

The fall CWHSLN meeting was held on Friday, September 14 at the Madison General Hospital Nursing Education Library. Representatives from all council units were present.

The morning's discussion centered on the Serials Location project. It was decided to name the list the Wisconsin Biomedicasl Union List of Serials. The list will be advertised in several newsletters including many non-medical. It was agreed that the money assessed for the state libraries above the Louisville charges would be divided 50% to CWHSLN, 50% to pay back the COWL loan. To maintain the State List, it was decided that all libraries in the list should pay a flat annual rate of \$10.00. The current State Union List of Serials Committees (SULS) will disband after the list is produced. The Council would like to say Thank You to members of the SULS Committee for all of your time and effort in helping to produce this essential tool.

Consortium coordinators will now need to name one person from their consortium to the State Union List of Serials Update Committee. Please submit names to Vicki by January 1, 1985.

Virginia Holtz will serve as the COWL representative until July 1, 1986.

Nine proposals for GMRMLN collection development funds were forwarded to the regional office for consideration. At this point, GMRMLN has not informed the Council of the recipients.

In November, a committee will be looking at software in the public domain for in-service training as possible fund requests for the state in 1985.

GMRMLN is now requesting only March and November consortium ILL statistics. Barb Schmiechen will still receive copies of the ILL statistics for the annual state data.

Other issues discussed were the new consultants registry revisions to CWHSLN guidelines, correspondence between the council and the State Task Force on Library Legislation, low enrollment of the A51 Basic Management course, and ONTYME II-Electronic Mail. It was noted that Todd Wehr Library-MCW uses ONTYME II and that UW-Middleton will also have that service.

The next meeting will be on Friday, April 19 in Steven's Point during the WHSLA Annual Meeting. Full minutes of the fall meeting are available from Barbara Schmiechen.

GMRMLN Management Office is interested in assisting network members to communicate via electronic mail. In July the Executive Committee of the Region encouraged network members to use Ontyme II because network members could send interlibrary loan requests to NLM using Ontyme II. Ontyme II has offered a discount for the 1st year subscription fee. An extension for entry has been granted until October 31 to obtain the minimum of 20 applications which are required to qualify for the discount subscription fee.
