## HEALTH SCIENCES ONLINE USERS

## STATE SERIALS LIST ORDER TO BE PLACED JANUARY 7

The new Wisconsin Biomedical List of Serials is now ready for ordering. The materials are now completely entered into the data base at the University of Louisville. Included in this list is approximately 64 Basic Health Sciences Libraries in Wisconsin. The two Resources Libraries, Todd Wehr Library-Medical College of Wisconsin and Middleton Health Sciences Library - UW-Madison are not included in this resource. This has been a project of the Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network with Joy Shong chairing the Committee.

Other members of the Committee throughout its history have been Mary Parrott, Betsy Merriam, Glenn Salter, Laverne Samb, Al Zimmerman, Eileen Emberson, Dorothy Kanter, and Helen Erke.

Full ordering information is elsewhere in this Newsletter. A \$5.00 charge is included within the full fee that will be used to reimburse COWL for its initial work for an OCLC generated serials list that the council later rejected. A small segment of that fee will also be used for Council expenses. This is an important resource for Basic Library sharing. You are urged to have a copy of this list in your collection.

WISCONSIN CONSULTANTS REGISTRY

A Wisconsin Consultants Registry was established at the end of 1982. Because of many changes within the State, the Registry is being updated and new persons are invited to apply for participation in the Registry. The Registry is consulted when requests come to the Coordinator's desk for assistance in organizing a health sciences library or the employment of a consultant. This Newsletter contains a form to apply for participation in the Registry.

The qualifications to be a part of the Registry are quoted from The Role Statement For Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Consultants.

"A health sciences library consultant should have a master's degree in library science, and should have at least three years of health science library experience. If the consultant does not have all of the above qualifications she/he should have an equivalent combination of training and experience such as five years of health science library management, or working with health science libraries in a consultative capacity.

The consultant should demonstrate good communication skills. She/he should have the ability to provide assistance on personnel, fiscal, and supervisory issues. The health sciences library consultant must show evidence of regular participation in continuing education courses in consulting, management, health sciences/hospital librarianship such as those sponsored by the Medical Library Association or Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Association. Membership in the Wisconsin Health Sciences Library Association is desirable.

The consultant must be familiar with existing national, state, and local library networks, and have a working knowledge of the National Library of Medicine's Regional Medical Library Program. The consultant should also have a thorough working knowledge of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospital's (JCAH) standards and other hospital library standards."

Anyone who feels they meet these qualifications may apply to be in the Registry. Applications are then evaluated by a Committee of the Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network.

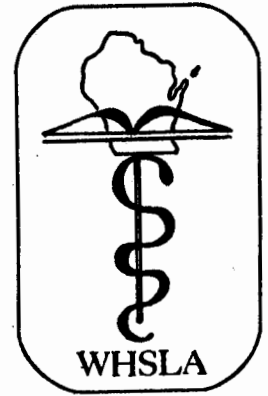
