WHSLA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order

The meeting of the Executive Board was called to order by President-elect Susan Anderson on Friday, November 9, 1984 at 9:05 a.m. at St. Mary's Hospital, Madison.

Present

In addition to Susan Anderson, the following board members and committee chairpeople were present: Ginny Wright, Su Mallampalli, Pat Wilcox, Midge Wos, Linda Oddan, Pat Craven, Barb Schmiechen, Mary Campfield Kotschi, Xena Kenyon, Mary Bayorgeon, Margaret Allen, Al Zimmerman, and Cindy Reinl.

Minutes

The reading of the April Executive Committee minutes was dispensed with; the minutes were approved as submitted.

Treasurer's Report

Pat Craven, WHSLA Treasurer, distributed copies of the Treasurer's report. As of November 5, 1984, WHSLA had a balance of \$5245.40.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Membership Committee

Pat Craven, Membership Committee chair, reported that WHSLA has 150 members. In October, the 1984 WHSLA Membership Roster was sent to members along with an updated copy of the bylaws and renewal notice. Pat noted that the renewal notice is for 1985 membership not 1984 as indicated on the form; a correction will be placed in the WHSLA NEWSLETTER. Completed notices must be returned by January 1, 1985.

Board members also discussed ways to recruit new members. It was suggested that the area coordinators be contacted about possibly distributing WHSLA brochures to prospective members.

Program Committee

Mary Bayorgeon, Conference Coordinator of the 1984 WHSLA Annual Meeting, distributed copies of the final and financial reports. The final report stated that thirty-six registered for the CE courses with thirty participating in the microcomputer course and six in the statistics class. Fifty-four paid-registrants attended the Friday program; WHSLA

members who gave substantive presentations had their registration fee waived. A detailed description of the conference's planning process and recommendations for the 1985 committee were also included. On behalf of WHSLA, Susan Anderson thanked the Fox River Valley group for hosting the conference.

Peg Allen, reporting for Barb DeWeerd, stated that the 1985 WHSLA Annual meeting will be held April 18-19, 1985 in Stevens Point. The theme will be "This one is for you," a departure from technology. Thursday will be devoted to CE courses with the possibility of offering a book repair workshop for nondegree personnel and/or a writing for publication session; it was suggested that Jana Bradley be contacted about conducting the writing workshop. The CE courses will be followed by a dinner/speaker; the speaker will be a staff member from the wellness institute. This will be followed by the board meeting. Friday's activities will include running (optional), speaker discussing personal growth, exhibits, swap table, and business meeting. Peg asked the board if annual meeting registration forms should be sent to non-librarians; the board agreed that this would be permissible provided that the costs are not exorbitant.

Continuing Education Committee
No report.

Online Users Subcommittee

Barb Schmiechen, reporting for Jackie Glick, distributed copies of the Subcommittee's report. As of November 1, 1984 fifteen individuals were registered for the three two-hour ETN sessions. MLA has approved 6.6 CE credit hours for the course. Presently, the Subcommittee is protesting the requirement for a post-test following each session which was instituted after WHSLA had made their arrangements; copies of the letters sent by Jackie are attached to the Subcommittee's report.

The Board decided to purchase audiocassettes of the ETN series. These tapes will be available via interlibrary loan from Middleton for those who are enrolled in the course.

Legislation Committee

Mary Kotschi, chairperson, reported that the committee has not met. Mary announced that she has been appointed to COLAND and will serve on the Interlibrary Loan Subcommittee. She reported that recommendations from the Library Legislation Task Force have been taken by Herbert J. Grover and will be submitted with the budget to Governor Earl. The budget and recommendations will be presented to the Legislature in January.

Planning Committee

Susan Anderson, chair, reported that on October 5, 1984 the committee met to discuss possible coverage of WHSLA officer and committee expenses and to come up with some alternative suggestions for surveying Board members, committee chairs, and recent past officers. On October 22, 1984 a survey was sent to twenty-four people of which eighteen responded; the results are attached to the committee's report. Susan indicated that it is the committee's hope that the Board will use the results to stimulate discussion and come to a decision.

The Board reviewed the committee's suggestions and formulated several recommendations. These recommendations are listed below and will be included on this year's ballot for the general membership's approval:

Travel Expenses

All board members and committee chairpeople are eligible for reimbursement of transportation costs for all meetings (e.g., Board, Council, or other meetings where they officially represent WHSLA), except the annual meeting, if their institutions cannot assume the fees.

Postage and Printing Costs

Costs of all official mailings and/or printed products (e.g., membership renewal notices, ballots, annual meeting printed programs/packets) are eligible for reimbursement if the individual's institution cannot assume the costs. Other postage and printing expenses (e.g., correspondence, committee mailings, etc.) are also eligible for reimbursement if an individual's institution cannot handle the costs; however, these costs are subject to the President's approval.

Telephone Expenses

All board members and committee chairpeople, except the Program Committee, when making calls that are directly involved in the work of the organization are eligible for telephone call reimbursement if their institution is unable to assume the fees and when their combined bill exceeds \$50.00.

Mode of Payment/Reimbursement

Transactions should be on a reimbursement basis or direct payment of bill, with the exception of the Program Committee, who may require a cash advance.

Old Business

Planning Committee

During its April 1985 meeting, the Board will discuss and decide upon the status and composition of the Planning Committee.

Budget

The Board decided that a WHSLA budget will be compiled by the President-elect and will be part of the President's final report.

Tax Exempt Status

WHSLA has applied for tax exempt status and is waiting to hear from the State.

Online Users Subcommittee

The Planning Committee will make recommendations concerning the Online Users Subcommittee's structure; a report will be given at the April 1985 meeting. In the meantime, Susan Anderson will contact Jackie Glick about having the present subcommittee begin planning for the 1985/86 sessions.

New Business

Annual Meeting

The Board decided that the Planning Committee should investigate whether or not WHSLA should continue holding annual meetings. It was suggested that members be surveyed in conjunction with the ballot; the survey will also ask questions about possible CE courses for the 1985 meeting.

Savings Account

When WHSLA attains tax exempt status, various interest bearing accounts will be investigated.

Council

Barb Schmiechen reported on the September Council meeting. She stated that WHSLA's President-elect will attend Council meetings. Also, the serials list is in Louisville and will be batched in January. The list will be available on paper or fiche.

Library of the Year

At the annual WLA meeting, Luther Hospital's Health Sciences Library was named "Library of the Year." Board members decided that WHSLA should send a letter congratulating them on their outstanding achievement.

Adjournment

The Board meeting adjourned at 12:03 p.m.
