## OTHER ORGANIZATION/ACRONYM LIST

(Editor's Note-Acronyms need to be deciphered for them to be useful. We have many new librarians/library managers who may find a reprint of Joy Shong's October 1983 list, as revised, helpful.)

COLAND - Council on Library and Network Development. Appointed by the Governor as an Advisory Committee to the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

COWL - Council of Wisconsin Librarians. An organization with the primary goal of facilitating resource sharing among all types of libraries in the state. Under auspices of COWL, WILS was established in 1972 and WLC in 1975.

CWHSLN - Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network. A council of the libraries of the health sciences network. Representatives are from Resource Libraries, Basic Libraries and organizations.

GMRMLN - Greater Midwest Health Sciences Library Network. A ten state region of medical libraries. Region 3 of the seven region National Health Sciences Library Network.

LCOMM - Library Council of Metropolitan Milwaukee. An organization that plans, promotes and coordinates cooperation and resource sharing among area libraries to help them better serve residents of metro Milwaukee. It represents over 120 academic, public, school and special libraries in Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington and Waukesha counties. Their address is: 814 W. Wisconsin Ave., Milwaukee 53233.

MASL - Milwaukee Area Serials Union List. A projected 1982 list of journal collections in 33 LCOMM libraries.

MC/MLA - Midwest Chapter/Medical Library Association. Although a chapter of MLA, one does not need to be a MLA member to join the Midwest Chapter. Its dues are \$5.00 per year and provide members with meeting notices, dues renewal notices, and a publication entitled MIDLINE which contains Chapter news. Membership states include: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, North Dakota, Ohio and Wisconsin. It meets annually in the Fall in various locations within its member states. Ask a member for an address - officers and addresses change.

MEDLARS - Medical Literature Analysis and Retrieval System. Computer based information storage and retrieval system of NLM established to furnish rapid access to NLM's large biomedical literature collection.

MEDLINE - MEDLARS On-Line. On-line search service providing access to MEDLAR citations of over 3,000 journal articles and material from selected monographs.

MeSH - Medical Subject Headings. Annual, current authority list for subject analysis of biomedical literature of NLM.

MLA - Medical Library Association. Annual membership dues are \$60.00 which includes a subscription to BULLETIN OF THE MEDICAL LIBRARY ASSOC., MLA NEWS, directory of the Medical Library Assoc. The Association has an annual meeting and offers a certification program, continuing education courses, placement services, etc. Contact: Medical Library Association, 919 N. NLM - National Library of Medicine.

OCLC - On-Line Computer Library Center. A computerized bibliographic data base for the purpose of shared cataloging, and other services, by all different types of libraries. Access for Wisconsin libraries is provided by WLC.

SLA - Special Library Association.

WHSLA - Wisconsin Health Science Librarians Assoc. State professional organization for health science librarians, meets annually in the Spring in various locations within the state. The group also publishes a newsletter monthly. The newsletter keeps you posted on activities of the association and developments in health science librarianship. WILS - Wisconsin Interlibrary Loan Service. Established to provide interloan access for academic libraries and libraries served by Reference & Loan Library to Madison campus library collections, MINITEX and Midwest Health Science Library Network.

WLA - Wisconsin Library Association.

WLC - Wisconsin Library Consortium. An organization of COWL, coordinates access for state's libraries to OCLC.

It is with sadness that we note the death of Ann Taylor. Ann died March 12 of leukemia at the University of Wisconsin Clinical Sciences Center. She had retired as Chief Librarian at the VA Hospital Library in Madison on January 1, attended a retirement party given by Madison health sciences librarians January 6, and then spent only a few days at home before returning to her final hospital stay. Ann served as WHSLA President, MC/MLA Executive Board member, and Co-chair of the 1978 MC/MLA Meeting in Madison. She leaves behind a strong legacy in her concern for health sciences libraries, women's issues, peace, and the environment. Our sympathy to her husband Jim and daughters, Anne, Julie, and Sarah. JOHN CRERAR LIBRARY

New John Crerar Library, containing what is believed to be the largest merged collection ever undertaken between two libraries, is now in its new location at the University of Chicago. The \$22 million, three-story building is the result of an agreement to establish a state-of-the-art facility, combining the university's library holdings in the pure sciences and the Crerar's holdings in the applied sciences. There are 39 miles of shelves with 900,000 volumes built up over more than 90 years, and room for another 400,000. Hanna H. Gray, president of the university, said: "The new John Crerar Library is a major resource not only within the University of Chicago but for the city, the region, and, indeed, the entire nation."

The general collections include many unbroken runs of periodicals and serial publications, including some journals covering more than 200 years. The combined holdings of Crerar and the university comprise one of the most extensive collections in the world in the history of science and medicine.

The new library was designed to put researchers and materials in comfortable proximity. It is part of a new, two-acre landscaped science quadrangle on the University of Chicago campus which links several buildings devoted to the basic physical and biological sciences. An underground passageway connects the library to the university's medical center.

The Crerar Library's original benefactor was John Crerar (1827-1889), the New York born son of Scottish immigrants. He moved to Chicago in 1862 to establish a railway supply company and quickly became one of the city's most successful businessmen. Crerar was widely active in civic and philanthropic affairs. When he died in 1889, his will stipulated that a large portion of his estate be used "for the erection, creation, maintenance, and endowment of a free public library."
