Library Certificate Courses

Several extension courses in library and information science leading to a professional development certificate are offered this fall by University of Wisconsin-Madison Communication Programs.

The "Certificate of Professional Development" is available in four specialized areas: library management, automation, information services brokering and youth services.

To earn a certificate, participants must complete at least 12 Continuing Education Units of extension education.

Begun in 1982, the extension certificate program at UW-Madison is the first management development program in the nation for library and information professionals.

I thought I'd let you know about some of the specific assignments that WHSLA Committees are working on at the present time. The BYLAWS AND GUIDELINES COMMITTEE is looking at numerous changes that need to be made, such as adding a section on the Planning Committee to the Bylaws, and adding the new guidelines on expense reimbursement to the Guidelines. All changes to the Bylaws will require membership approval before they are final. The CONTINUING EDUCATION COMMITTEE has put together a

survey to find out what members need in the way of CE offerings. It is attached to this Newsletter-- please be sure to fill it out and return it so that the Committee can plan programs that will really be of help to you. The LEGISLATION COMMITTEE continues to keep abreast of current events and will report on them as appropriate, and the MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE is working on a new membership roster which will be published in the near future. The PLANNING COMMITTEE is looking at the issues of area representation for the Board and program planning responsibility for our Annual Meetings, and is analyzing the results of the Spring survey. The ELECTION AND NOMINATING COMMITTEES are working to revise the Bylaws and Guidelines pertinent to them in an effort to streamline and clarify procedures. The NEWSLETTER COMMITTEE has started to submit news or articles of interest to this Newsletter each month, and the ONLINE USERS COMMITTEE is putting the finishing touches on its 1985-86 Online Users ETN series which begins in December. It is also working on putting together a directory of online search consultants.

A meeting of the Executive Board will be held on Friday, October 4, 1985 at 10:00 AM at Robbins Restaurant in Oshkosh. Please submit to me by September 16 any items that you would like to have placed on the agenda. All WHSLA members are welcome--please contact me if you are interested in coming.

UNAVAILABILITY OF THE ONLINE CATALOG

We have asked BRS to take down the Regional Online Union Catalog (CMHS database) effective August 31, 1985. Funding from the National Library of Medicine to support storage and updating has been exhausted. You will want to remove all traffic from the Interlibrary Loan Subsystem by that date and transfer them to some other system.

There are plans to remount the database in the future. Remounting should correct any inaccurate location codes. A remount catalog would have to operate on a cost recovery basis. All current users will be notified concerning costs and method of access when the new catalog is available.

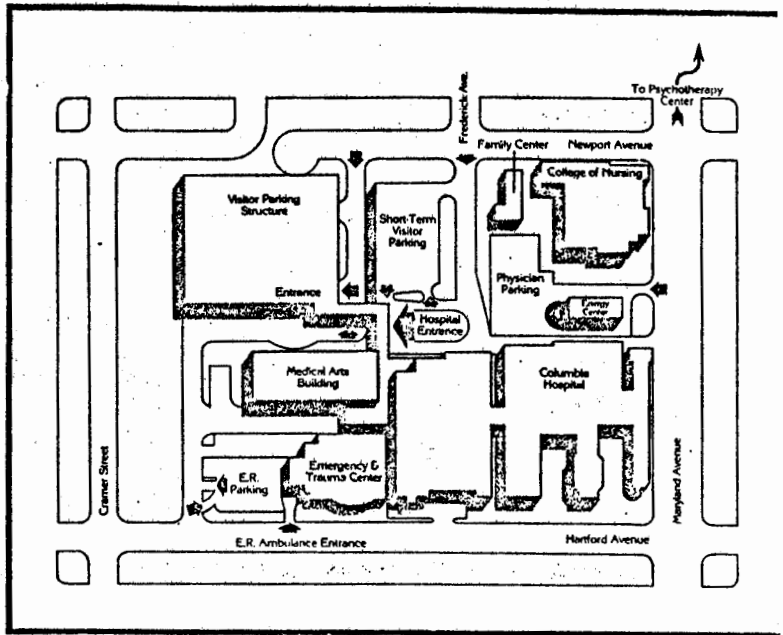
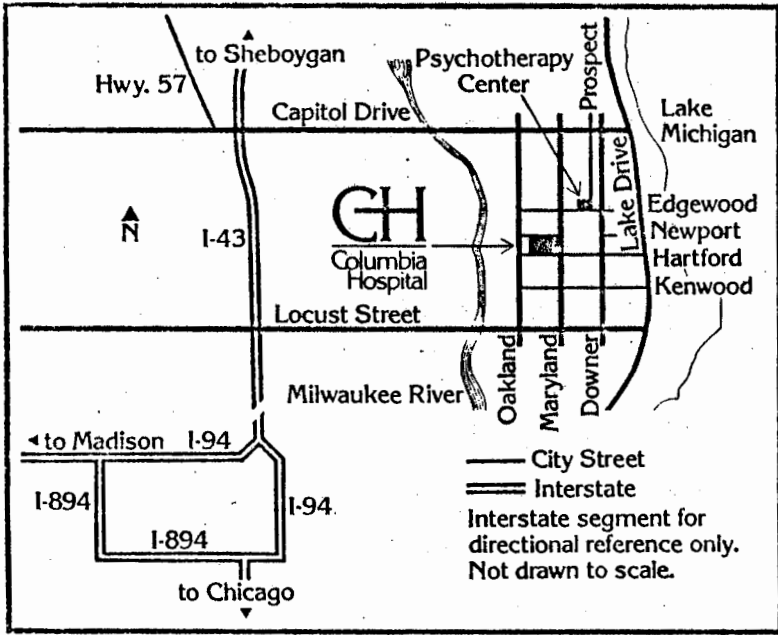
