## MCW LIBRARIES AWARDED GMRMLN COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT GRANT

GMRMLN Executive Committee announced the awarding of six Collection Development Grants for 1985. The Medical College of Wisconsin Libraries received one of those six grants for the amount of \$4,036 to collect materials in the area of Health Care Financing and Marketing. ## CWHSLN FALL MEETING

Members of the Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network (CWHSLN) met for their Fall Meeting on September 11 at Winnebago Mental Health Institute.

Vicki Schluge submitted her resignation as Chair at the end of the Meeting. Margaret Warpinski of St. Vincent's-Green Bay was elected as Interim Chair.

An election will be held this fall to elect a State Representative and Alternate to the GMRMLN Regional Advisory Council as well as a Representative at Large to CWHSLN.

It was announced that the updating packet will go out to participants in the Wisconsin Biomedical Union List of Serials on September 13. Updating material must be sent to the Consortium representative by November 1. Materials will be submitted to Louisville by mid-November. Joy Shong's contact with Louisville indicated that the list should be ready about three months from time of receipt and the hard copy printing should be much improved.

Treasurer of the Union List, Joan Zweifel, reported that 81 Union lists were sold. After paying all bills \$393.00 remained in the treasury. The first repayment of \$200.00 toward the outstanding COWL bill was made. One hundred dollars was earmarked to send our State Representative to the possible unfunded GMRMLN Meeting in November.

The new ILL fee schedule from the Resource Libraries, the guidelines for journal location verification, and interconsortium borrowing guidelines were discussed. Linda Oddan was responsible for drafting a statement to appear in the October WHSLA Newsletter regarding interconsortium referrals.

The Council decided not to ask for ETN time for A51 Basic Management for Health Sciences Librarians in 1986-87, but to work on alternative methods of introducing librarians new to the health sciences field as well as new library managers to medical librarianship.

RESOURCE LIBRARIES 1986 ILL FEE SCHEDULES

Medical College of Wisconsin Libraries

SWHSL Consortium (Seven southeastern counties). As of January 1986, the charge will be \$2.25 for journal articles and \$2.25 for the loan of a book (this includes postage). Requests from individuals from these institutions are charged \$4.00 per loan. No books are mailed to individuals. There is no charge for referrals.

Individual Health Professionals and/or Health Related Non-profit Institutions. There is a \$4.00 charge for journal articles and a \$4.00 charge for loan of books which began January 1985. Books are mailed only to libraries. Individuals must pick up books at Circulation. There is a \$4.00 referral charge for persons not affiliated with MCW libraries and who does not come through a library. This can include health professionals.

Middleton Health Sciences Library

Beginning January 1, 1986 the in-state interlibrary loan charges for Middleton Health Sciences Library will be \$2.25 per request for both the lending of original material and for photocopied journal articles (articles of 21 or more photocopied exposures will be charged an additional \$.15 per exposure to the base price). This includes postage costs. There is no charge for referrals. Rush requests add \$1.00 to this charge. For-profit business will be announced at a later date.

INTERCONSORTIUM INTERLIBRARY LOAN REQUEST REFERRAL

At the September 11, 1985 CWHSLN meeting, interconsortium interlibrary loan request referral was discussed.

It was decided that libraries who want requests referred should indicate PLEASE REFER at top of ALA form and list up to 3 locations from Wisconsin Biomedical Union List of Serials--e.g., WAU, SFM, MSW.

If the third library in the list is MCW or UW-Middleton, starting January 1986, you must include location verification from either MCW or UW-Middleton lists of serials, or from the GMRMLN List of Serials. The location string would look like WAU, MSW, MCW--GMRMLN, 4/85, fiche 3.

If the third library is MCW or UW-Middleton and cost indicated is sufficient, they will continue referral into network.

The ALA interim report (pink copy) can be returned to borrowing library to indicate referral.

If you don't indicate PLEASE REFER, the request will be returned to you if lending library is unable to fill the request.

At the fall meeting of the Northern Wisconsin Health Science Libraries Cooperative, Deb Nordgren and Al Zimmermann discussed the pros and cons of two of the "user friendly" search systems currently available. Howard Young Medical Center has BRS which is a multi-file system making it a little more versatile. Marshfield Clinic has PaperChase as I mentioned in the July "Newsletter Notes." Since that time, Al has discovered a problem with both systems. Unless you happen to have a telecommunications node locally, there will be a long-distance telephone toll charge in addition to the on-line charges incurred. For Marshfield Clinic in the month of August, this almost doubled the cost of PaperChase making it quite a lot more expensive than MEDLINE with its NLM-supplied WATS line.

MCW HOSTS PAPERCHASE DEMONSTRATIONS

(PaperChase is a computer program that enables the end user to search the National Library of Medicine's MEDLINE File). A representative from PaperChase will give a one-hour slide presentation about the system. After the slide presentation, practice passwords will be made available for use for up to two hours. Demonstrations are scheduled for: 8:00 AM - 11:00 AM, 12:30 PM - 3:30 PM, and 4:00 PM - 7:00 PM in Room C232 of the Medical College. Practice on the terminals will be done in the Todd Wehr Library on library terminals. Please call the library at 257-8302 and let us know if you are planning on attending, and at what time. There is no charge for the demonstration or practice time.

Starting in January 1986, Middleton Health Sciences Library and the Medical College of Wisconsin Library will require location verification for journal titles requested through Interlibrary Loan. These new guidelines appeared in detail in the September 1985 issue or the WHSLA Newsletter. The following is an example of an ILLA form which has been filled out to meet the new requirements for verification. The numbered statements correspond with the numbers on the form.

1. Date of request.
2. Date after which material is no longer needed.
3. Request for referral, if desired. Requests will not be referred unless referral is specifically stated. (May also state: "Refer if no charge" which indicates that the borrowing library will not accept fill charges.)
4. Name, address and LIBID of borrowing institution (it is possible to have this pre-printed on the forms).
5. Patron name, position, affiliation.
6. Citation of requested item (this example is for a periodical). Include both the journal title and article title, author, etc.
7. Citation verification: verify the source of the requested item. (CIM is Cumulated Index Medicus). Supply whatever information is available (e.g., where the patron learned of the item requested). Include here sources checked even if item remains unverified.
8. Location verification: indicate here the serials lists (including date of the list) which identifies that the lending library owns the title requested. Examples: MHSL, 1985, p.663 or MCW, 4/85, p.6 or GM, 6/24/85, fiche 7. Also at CIN, ILL, IOW, OSU. If unable to verify location, indicate this on the form, state sources checked, and send request to appropriate resource library. Example: Unable to verify; not in MHSL or MCW union lists. Requests may be returned unfilled if there is no indication of an attempt to verify locations.
- 8a. Call number as supplied in MHSL union list-Optional.
9. Name and address of lending institution.
10. Indication of copyright compliance. It is a matter of standard policy that copy right compliance be indicated for all requests.
11. Signature and title of person authorizing the request.
12. Indication of whether this is a request for a loan or a photocopy.

When requesting ILL's through electronic mail, Citation verification (#7) should be included in verification area, whereas Location verification (#8) should appear in the Remarks area along with your referral statement.

A note to add about the use of MHSL Serials List: All titles are identified as being held at WIS (Middleton), WIW (Weston, Middleton's branch) or both. All requests should be sent to Medical Library Service, 1305 Linden Drive, Madison, Wisconsin 53706. Verification involves the interpretation of the WIS or WIW holdings lines only. Other information in the serial list entry is not used for verification.
