## FROM THE WHSLA PRESIDENT

The WHSLA Executive Board held its Fall meeting on October 4, 1985 at Robbins Restaurant in Oshkosh. Full minutes of the meeting will be appearing in an upcoming issue of this Newsletter, but I thought I would highlight a couple of items of particular importance.

Two recommendations that were made by the Planning Committee were unanimously approved by the Board. The first concerns program planning for our annual meetings. It was decided that, beginning with the 1987 Annual Meeting, a statewide program committee will be appointed to plan all program aspects of each annual meeting. The Continuing Education Committee will be responsible for planning CE courses and handling their arrangements. A third committee, made up of members from the area that is hosting the meeting, will be responsible for handling local arrangements only--hotel accommodations, meals, registration, equipment needs, etc. This plan should help to relieve the burden often felt in the past by members of smaller and geographically spread-out consortia who have had to plan all aspects of a meeting with only a very small group of people actively involved. It will also give people from all over the State a chance to get involved in program planning for any meeting, not just those held in a person's own geographic area.

The second Planning Committee recommendation that was approved concerns area representation on the Executive Board. A plan was approved that will merge the Western and West Central regions for purposes of Board representation, thereby reducing the number of area representatives from six to five. (The number of representatives will be elected in even-numbered years on the same ballot that is used for electing a president-elect. There will be two nominees from each geographic area, and members will vote only for a candidate to represent their respective areas. While implementing this plan will involve some Bylaws changes (which probably won't be final until our 1986 Annual Meeting), it was felt that we should go ahead with it this Spring since it should be most helpful in streamlining what has been a rather cumbersome process of securing area representatives for the Board in the past.

I welcome your comments on both of these changes. Furthermore, if you are interested in serving on the Program Committee for the 1987 Annual Meeting in Milwaukee, please get in touch with me soon.

Finally, I would like to close by saying that it was good to hear from the Treasurer that WHSLA is healthy both financially and in members. Sixteen new members have joined the Association since our Spring 1985 meeting, for a grand total of 158 members. Glad to have you all!

#### GET WITH WISCAT

GET WISCAT! With WISCAT you can verify book, AV and serial titles that are owned by the Middleton Health Sciences Library, Medical College of Wisconsin Library, Luther Hospital (Eau Claire) and even the Dept. of Health and Social Services Library PLUS 296 other libraries in Wisconsin. WISCAT is a COM (Computer Output Microform) catalog on microfiche that was developed by the Wisconsin Division for Library Services. It is divided with separate author, title and subject sections. WISCAT is invaluable for verifying interlibrary loan, but it can also be used for reference, cataloging, conversion and acquisitions.

The current edition of WISCAT (3rd) has over 2.3 million holdings. The cost of this edition is \$441.04. BUT, THE 2ND EDITION OF WISCAT (WITH 1,850,266 TITLES) IS AVAILABLE FREE. #### NLM RESOURCE IMPROVEMENT GRANTS

A recent conversation with Fran Johnson of NLM indicated that the NLM Resource Improvement Grants for single institutions and consortia have been funded. Single institutions and consortia are urged to apply. The only change for 1986 is that the closing dates have changed to February 1, June 1 and October 1.

Any public or private nonprofit institution or agency authorized or qualified to carry on the functions of a health science library, or any public or private nonprofit or for-profit related instrumentality, is eligible for a Resource Grant. "Related instrumentality" means a public or private institution, organization, or agency, other than a health science library, whose primary function is the acquisition, preservation, dissemination, and/or processing of information relating to the health sciences. Eligible health science institutions include, but are not limited to, schools of health professions, health-related research institutions, and hospitals. However, institutions are not eligible to apply on behalf of libraries which have as their principal purpose the provision of health information to patients or the lay public.

#### Single Institution

Any previous recipients for the Improvement Grant are not eligible for additional NLM support as a single institution. Up to \$4,000 maximum is provided for one budget period, usually twelve months, to purchase a basic and current health sciences library collection. There is a matching requirement of 4:1 from the applicant institution. The State Coordinator is willing to critique any application drafts.

The review process takes approximately 7-8 months. Applicants are notified by letter of the review recommendation.
