NEWSLETTER NOTES

Deb Nordgren at Howard Young Medical Center gets top marks as a "smart computer shopper" according to a Dec. 16, 1985 article in InfoWorld.* They rate her Leading Edge, Model D Personal Computer as a super value. It's a highly compatible IBM PC clone. For the bargain price of \$1,495, you get a complete system (minus only a printer). This includes an IBM PC-style keyboard, two 360K half-height floppy disk drives, a 12-inch high-resolution monochrome (green) monitor, a Hercules-compatible monochrome graphics card, an IBM PC-compatible color graphics card, 256K of RAM (random-access memory) expandable to 640K on the system board, parallel and serial ports, battery-backed clock/calendar, a 130 watt power supply, and four full-size IBM compatible expansion slots.

In addition to excellent marks when InfoWorld's reviewer evaluated the Leading Edge using hundreds of programs written for the IBM PC, the setup was, "just about the easiest that we've seen". It took less than 20 minutes to have the system ready to run.
