DOCLINE INFORMATION

GHRMLN has divided the ten states of Region 3 into three groups in preparation for the activation of DOCLINE. Group I which included libraries from Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana was activated on July 16. Wisconsin is in Group III. It was originally anticipated that Group III would be activated in late September or October, but NLM has now moved the date to mid-August. Not all Wisconsin DOCLINE participants will be put online at the same time. Those institutions which submitted their DOCLINE application forms and routing tables before the June 2 deadline will be the first to be activated. Activation for libraries which were late with their applications will be delayed. NLM plans to have all Region 3 Basic Health Sciences Libraries online by early fall.
