## BUSINESS DATELINE AND ABI/INFORM TRAINING WORKSHOP

The three hour workshop covers the basics of searching Business Dateline and provides techniques for developing effective search strategies using the controlled vocabulary and classification codes. The 1986 ABI/INFORM enhancements, including the addition of the company name field and D-U-M-S number, are briefly discussed. Hands-on practice, with access to Business Dateline and ABI/INFORM is included, so bring search topics or problems. The workshop is designed for searchers with systems training and/or online experience. Each participant will receive comprehensive workbooks for both databases and a check for \$25.00 of Business Dateline use on the Dialog system.

If you are attending MIA in Portland, attendance at the strategic planning hearings is encouraged.

## BIOETHICS/INE

Several of MEDIARS lesser known databases are important additions to searching in MEDLINE. BIOETHICS/INE focuses on questions in ethics and public policy in the fields of health care and biomedical research. Produced by the Bioethics Information Retrieval project of the Kennedy Institute of Ethics at Georgetown University, BIOETHICS/INE includes citations on such topics as euthanasia, organ donation and transplantation, the allocation of health care resources, patients' rights, codes of professional ethics, in vitro fertilization and other reproductive technologies, genetic intervention, abortion, behavior control, mental health therapies, and human experimentation. The literature scope of BIOETHICS/INE includes health sciences, law, philosophy, religion, social sciences, and the popular media.

Currently there are approximately 20,000 citations to English-language materials dating from 1973 to the present. Nine document types are represented: journal articles, monographs, analytics (chapters in monographs), newspapers articles, court decisions, bills, laws, audiovisual materials, and unpublished documents. Updating is monthly.

BIOETHICS.IINE is best searched using keywords which consist of subject terms drawn from the controlled vocabulary of the Bioethics Thesaurus and proper nouns (such as names of person, places, organizations, and court decisions). The thesaurus is currently available for \$5.00. About 80% of the keywords are mapped to MeSH terms, making it possible to search BIOETHICS.IINE using MeSH. One of the main differences in searching is that the Bioethics Thesaurus terms must be searched with a keyword (KW) qualifier.

The first three are of general use in Junior High School, High School, and College students as well as members of the general public. The last two are for the medical professional and provide information on how best to deal with the needs of the AIDS patients.

 Begins with an introduction by Dr. Richard Keeling, chairman of a national task force on AIDS. The introduction tells us why we need to know about AIDS and is especially appropriate for adult audiences. The second section, about 13 minutes, is done in a cartoon program format using straightforward conversation and anxiety-reducing cartoons, to tell the AIDS story in a direct yet nonthreatening way. The dialogue is between a doctor and an inquisitive audience. It is suggested that for classroom use, to start the presentation with the cartoon program. (FILM IDEAS) 1985

- AIDS: A NURSING PERSPECTIVE (PART I)**

 A presentation for the Nursing Professional. Introduces and defines AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome). Examines the epidemiology and pathophysiology of AIDS: who is at risk and the problems of opportunistic infections such as pneumocystis carinii, pneumonia, tuberculosis, enteric infections, and herpes simplex. Focuses on infection control and presents the latest recommendations from the Center for Disease Control to help nurses in implementing appropriate precautions without imposing social isolation. Emphasizes the importance of handwashing and differentiates precautions for AIDS and for the opportunistic infections associated with it.
