### ONLINE SEARCHING COURSES

#### ETN Online Users Group

MLS RETRIEVAL OF UW CAMPUS DOCUMENTS

The Center for Health Sciences Library of the University of Wisconsin is pleased to announce an expansion of its Medical Library Service. MLS will now be able to retrieve documents from other UW campus libraries such as Agriculture, Business, Engineering, Memorial, etc.

This new service will provide photocopies of needed items to the requesting library. MLS will attempt to first fill the item from our own collections at Middleton and Weston. Then, if the item is not available, we will access the holdings of other University libraries. If the item is not available from the Madison campus libraries, we will then try to refer the request to Region 03 Resources Libraries, or on to NLM, providing that the requesting library has indicated "Refer" on the ILL form. It will continue to be important for the requesting library to indicate referral instructions, as well as a Maxcost statement.

The charge to Wisconsin Basic Health Sciences Libraries for this service will be \$3.25 per item. (MLS will continue to fill requests from Middleton and Weston Libraries for the \$2.25 basic rate for photocopies or original materials, just as has been done in the past). If MLS cannot supply the item, there will be no charge. We anticipate that our turn-around time to requesting libraries will be an additional day or two from our normal MLS fill time. Some restrictions will apply to the retrieval of documents. We will be sending a policy statement with the next MLS invoice to libraries which are currently using MLS services. If you do not receive a copy, call us at (608) 262-6524.

It is our hope that this service will answer some of the many needs of the Wisconsin Basic Health Sciences Libraries. Access to literature which is within the scope of the hospital library users, but not necessarily held by Health Sciences Libraries, has been difficult to obtain in the past. By offering this service, MLS will provide that access without long time delays and high interlibrary loan fees.

WILS CHARGES

WILS has announced a price increase for requests which are referred to them after July 1, 1987. Items which are sent to WILS will be charged \$4.45 per item, whether or not the item is filled. MLS will continue its policy of accessing the WILS network for Wisconsin Basic Health Sciences Libraries for items which cannot be obtained through other means. In light of the new service now available through MLS, the best times to use the WILS network will be for books, or for items which are owned by WILS libraries not on the UW-Madison campus. It is recommended that all other requests be filled through the MLS/UW-Madison campus service, as that will be quicker and cheaper for the hospital libraries. As before, it will be necessary to indicate a Maxcost and a date needed by for requests which will be referred to WILS.

GREATER MIDWEST REGIONAL MEDICAL LIBRARY COUNCIL NEWS

The Regional Council meeting originally planned for March 12 and 13 was finally held July 24 in Chicago Summer heat - a change from our usual snowstorms!

Several items discussed at the Regional Council meeting will affect your libraries and/or require action from the state council. Included with this newsletter is a questionnaire which should be returned to me by September 15, 1987 to meet regional deadlines for a portion of our response. If you have concerns regarding other issues, please contact me.

State Council Representatives

The state council representatives met in the late afternoon on July 23, prior to the full council meeting. Several of the issues discussed at that meeting were further developed at the Regional Council and reports from both groups are combined below. A couple of issues were basically limited to State Council discussion - particularly the Serials Exchange proposal and FIDO, the GMRMLN bulletin board.

Ruby May presented the concept of enlarging the Serials Exchange program now in place for resource libraries to include all network libraries. Basically, this program uses a PC database to merge lists of titles available for exchange into one alphabetical list, instead of several. This can then be merged with your individual want list. She envisions consortia and/or state level lists, which would be shared at these local levels, to be edited after items are claimed and then made into a regional list which could be downloaded from FIDO for local use. Participation would be voluntary. This will be discussed at our fall council meeting - we need to indicate our interest, if any, by November 15.

The bulletin board was discussed, with a strong consensus that an 800# was required to get more libraries involved in calling in. State newsletter editors were particularly encouraged to use FIDO as a source of current information for their newsletters. At the Regional Council meeting, a motion supporting a request to NLM for funding of an 800# was passed.

The following topics were discussed at the Regional Council meeting on the 24th:

RML Director's Report - from Irwin Pizer

The proposal for Year 3 of the contract is due in October. They will continue to make presentations at national and regional meetings of health professionals, and propose adding some resource libraries. He needs to know areas of interest for State Councils, by the beginning of September. Since we will not meet before then please write to him directly with a copy to me, and/or indicate your concerns on the enclosed survey and return it immediately.

He also reported that the ILL National Maximum will increase to \$8.00 effective October 1, 1987; that NLM has instituted a FAX surcharge of \$3.00, and that DOCLINE charges will begin in January, 1988. Preservation was discussed; a video copy of the film discussed in the July 3 Sources will be available from the Management Office. He announced that he plans to retire in November, 1989.

The RML has submitted proposals for two projects - one in preservation and one for veterinary medicine - in response to a request for proposals referred to as RML enhancements by NLM. The NLM Long Rang Plan will be an agenda item for the next Regional Council meeting.

Site visits to the various states in the region are continuing; Wisconsin is scheduled for 1990. We need to think about plans for this meeting.

Health Professionals Task Force

Each state council has been asked to get health professional input on the questions originally posed to this task force - this will be an agenda item at our next State Council meeting. These questions were:

1. Do health professionals perceive a greater availability of enduser searching as a need?
2. How do you currently obtain information?
3. What are the barriers to obtaining information?
4. What would the health professionals like to see?

GMRMLN Union List of Serials

Costs of production for the union list are increasing, and sales are down. The 1988 price will be \$105.00.

NLM Online Updates

As many of you are aware, NLM decided to discontinue in-person online updates in 1987. At the meeting of the State Council representatives, most reported some concern from their states; this seemed dependent on the perceived quality of the updates as experienced by the searchers they contacted. Recent updates with Helen Ann Brown were highly rated; some earlier ones were not. There was general consensus that there is a need for local, interactive sessions that are educationally sound - printed update information is not appropriate as the only source of this information - and there is value in getting the searchers together for problem solving. These issues were further discussed at the Regional Council meeting, with sharing of the concerns of both basic unit and resource libraries. One new issue raised was whether separate sessions were needed for advanced searchers and for addressing the needs of those involved in end user training. NLM is looking at new formats for training/updating and will be interested in your opinions - write to them or the RML, and respond to the enclosed questionnaire.

NLM's RML Network Participating Registry

Ruby May presented information on NLM's plans to identify and recognize network participants via a registry program. Participants would receive a certificate naming them as a network participant, as well as the usual network benefits we have been receiving - including regional and NLM newsletters, opportunity for input into RML programs and services, and guaranteed access to RML interlibrary loan services. In other words, this program would provide a means of regularly updating mailing lists and gathering basic data about network participants that could assist in program planning and promotion of network activities when requesting continued federal funding. Definitions of a network participant, responsibilities of participants, and benefits of participation have been proposed by NLM, along with a two page questionnaire that participants would need complete, with updating of the requested information on a biennial basis. In addition to institutional directory type information, there are questions covering administration, personnel and budget, resources, and services. This questionnaire was the main topic of discussion - were the questions clear, and would the information requested be helpful? A few of us agreed to assist Ruby in making suggestions for changes; this was accomplished via the bulletin board after the meeting. Future regional directories will be published based on this questionnaire.

Collection Development

Chris Millson-Martula reported on Collection Development activities. 17 basic health science libraries from 9 states applied for participation in the conspectus project; these applications will be reviewed by the regional Collection Development Committee. Additional libraries, especially those with specialized collections, are being encouraged to apply - contact Midge Wos for additional information. He demonstrated the type of information that participants will receive. The region will be investigating potential sources of funding, such as grants, in addition to the minimal NLM funding for collection development. Future collection development grants will be correlated with needs identified by the conspectus evaluation, which will be a potential benefit to participants.

DOCLINE

Kim Goldman reported that regional DOCLINE participation has increased to 61% of eligible libraries (50 Wisconsin libraries, or 74% of those eligible). She surveyed non participants and learned that 60% of those who haven't joined lack the necessary equipment. Changes in routing tables are now being sent in - send her your revised routing tables as soon as possible - by September 15 at the latest. Various changes in DOCLINE were discussed; several enhancements are planned for 1988 - see your July 3 Sources. Future changes will place the burden of payment on the borrower. An analysis of the effect of level X as opposed to level 3 listing was conducted; this is also reported in 3 Sources. Some changes could be made in the coding at Louisville that would improve the routing. New records are being input at Level 3, as well as routine changes. However, changing all records to Level 3 is impossible given the size of the file.

FAX Update

Ruby May reported that there are now 198 FAX sites in the region, including 17 resource libraries. The 1986 GHRMLN FAX Directory is still available from the region - see 3 Sources. Many libraries may have access to telefacsimile equipment in another office - you may wish to check with your administration. The 1987 directory will be published in October - if you are not listed and have or have access to FAX equipment, send the information indicated in 3 Sources to the Management Office by September 25.

This is my personal report of the meetings, and is thus filtered by my impressions and concerns. If you would like more information, please contact me, your resource library director, or the Management Office. We are all interested in your input.

ONLINE NEWS

Review Articles

NLM is revising its policy on indexing review articles. For 1988, it is planned that the definition of reviews will be broadened to include reviews of known or published cases, articles labeled "state-of-the-art" by the author or publisher, and instructional subject reviews. In response to searchers' requests, the publication date of literature cited in an author's bibliography will no longer be a criterion for selection or rejection of an article as a review.

Author Affiliation

Effective with the January 1988 update, the address field (AD) containing author affiliation data will now be retained in MEDLINE. Previously, it had been available on in SDILINE and had been dropped from the MEDLINE update. The address in Medline will have the same characteristics as in SDILINE - printable and stringsearchable only. Postings file limitations in MEDLINE preclude making the field directly searchable at this time. This will begin with the 8801 entry month.
