NLS IN WISCONSIN

The University of Wisconsin-Madison now has a campus online catalog (NLS) with dial-up ports for use via a microcomputer. Microcomputer documentation is available to assist anyone in the State to use this catalog which gives you the complete retrospective monograph and serials title holdings of the CHS Libraries and Primate Library. The majority of the rest of the campus libraries have included their holdings back to 1976. The process will require a long distance phone call into the NLS data base. (The In-WATTS number does not apply to NLS searching.)

Jo Crawford, CHS Libraries Automation Librarian, Michele Jacques, and Barbara Schmiechen will be making a pilot presentation to the members of the South Central Consortium in October about the system, and training them in some basic searching strategies for efficient searching.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

NLM's Budget

Although Information Hotline reported in its July-August issue that President Reagan recommended a \$2,000,000 reduction in the National Library of Medicine's budget, correspondence of August 6 from Wisconsin Representative Robert Kastenmeier indicated that the House has recommended \$9.98 million up from \$9.4 million in 1987. Final appropriations have not been agreed upon by the Senate and House. President Reagan's proposal would have created reduced funding for the Medical Library Resource Project grants, a part of the Medical Library Assistance appropriation, according to the Information Hotline.

NTIS

Representative Kastenmeier also indicated that the privatization of NTIS would very unlikely succeed in passing the Congress. "It would probably cost more to implement in terms of employee costs and other items, than any sale would realize. There have been various proposals to sell assets of the federal government to the private sector. In general, those proposals were viewed as attempts to quick fix the budget deficit. I don't believe any such sales would necessarily help the deficit problem, since they are one time shots at raising revenues, and not part of a coherent financial plan. The NTIS, for example, is self-supporting and costs the taxpayers nothing, but provides an invaluable resource to the public."
