FROM THE WHSLA PRESIDENT

The WHSLA Board Meeting will take place at the Quality Inn South, Madison, October 15, 1987, from 1:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. One of the items on the agenda is the charge to the planning committee for the coming year. Now that the Guidelines have been revised, the planning committee can concentrate on drawing up a strategic plan and long term goals for WHSLA. I urge all of you to help the planning committee with your ideas and by responding to any request.

There are many questions with which the organization must now deal, not only plans and goals, but also more fundamental problems of participation of the membership. Each year the nomination committee find it more difficult to persuade members to run for executive office, the President has difficulty appointing Chairs of committees. It is important that executive officers have held other positions in WHSLA and know something of the running of the organization. For the same reasons, Chairs should be appointed from members of the committee. Committee members are easy to find, but do not want the extra responsibility of chairing. This is your organization--let's get together to make it work. This year I have had the additional problem of finding a new Treasurer. Jan Curnes has been doing a great job for several years, but since she is no longer on the Board I must appoint a new Treasurer. I have had no luck so far, and truly appreciate Jan's offer to continue until someone else is appointed. We shall also deal with this at the Board Meeting.

The next few years can be a very exciting time for health care libraries. We are constantly being told that we are information experts, and that information is a "hot" item. Changes are already taking place and at the same time national and regional help is diminishing especially for basic units. It is harder to keep current with all the new developments, to attend meetings and continuing education courses. WHSLA can address some of these problems and hope to come up with answers, but only if we have the participation and cooperation of the entire membership. I hope we can all work together to plan and achieve our goals.

ST. ELIZABETH HOSPITAL CD-ROM TEST SITE

St. Elizabeth Hospital Health Science Library, Appleton, has been notified by State Superintendent, Department of Public Instruction, Herbert Grover, that it is one of thirteen libraries in the state selected to participate in a test of the WISCAT database on CD-ROM. This project was recommended by both the Council on Library and Network Development (COLAND) and the Library Services and Construction Act Advisory Committee.

The WISCAT database will be the largest library database to be placed on CD-ROM to date. The Division for Library Services considers the project to be experimental and wants to thoroughly test the product before releasing it for use by libraries. Test site libraries will be asked to test the software for reference and interlibrary loan use for a period of six weeks. During this time, library staff from other libraries will be welcome to visit the test site libraries for a demonstration. Training sessions for library staff at the test sites will be held in early November. At the conclusion of the test, the test site will be expected to complete a written report describing the strengths and weaknesses of the CD-ROM version of the database for the purposes tested.

ETN SEMINARS FOR HEALTH SCIENCE LIBRARIAN BEGINS

For a long time health sciences librarians have been looking for studies that indicate the value of those libraries on clinical decision making as it relates to patient care. David King, of the University of Illinois at Urbana, principal investigator for a major research project linking the quality of patient care in hospitals to the institutions' library services, will be one of the presenters for our first ETN Seminars of this season. He will be joined by Julia Faust of River Grove, IL and Kathryn Greenwald of Milwaukee. Both of these women were instrumental in the initiation of this project and were in participating libraries at the time of the research. David King has made a number of presentations on this research and we are fortunate to have these persons at this seminar. This is an important study and its results have implications for the present and future of health sciences libraries.

COOPERATIVE COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

GMMLN, the Greater Midwest Regional Medical Library Network, announces the implementation of its Coordinated Cooperative Collection Development Program.

The program's goals include an improvement in the characteristics of the regional collection in terms of quality, quantity, depth, and breadth; the optimization of the use of institutional monetary resources; and an increase in the Region's self-sufficiency by improving its regional ILL fill rate. These goals relate to the program's four components which are as follows:

1. resource analysis - a descriptive evaluation of collections in the Region using the Research Libraries Group Conspectus
2. resource development-identification of serial titles to be purchased and subject areas to be covered in order to either fill gaps or develop greater depth in the Region's collections; funds from NLM and other sources will be used to purchase these materials
3. resource retention - member commitments to retain particular serial titles or develop collections in specific subject areas in order to insure the continued regional availability of information resources
4. a regional collection development policy manual.

The resource analysis phase is currently underway with 22 Resource Libraries (mainly medical school libraries) and 21 Basic Health Science Libraries (mainly hospital libraries) conducting the RLG Conspectus. Conspectus data will be analyzed to identify collection strengths and gaps so that funds can be expended later this year and early next year for the cooperative acquisition of materials. Additional rounds of conspectus evaluation and cooperative acquisition will continue in subsequent years.

Libraries from Wisconsin currently participating in the program are: Gundersen/Lutheran Medical Center (LaCrosse), Medical College of Wisconsin, and University of Wisconsin (Madison).

WISCONSIN DATA ON MEETINGS (WISDOM)

The Division for Library Services has developed a clearinghouse for the listing of statewide library-related professional meetings and continuing education programs. Listings are posted and maintained on a bulletin board called WISDOM which is accessed through the ALANET electronic mail system of the American Library Association. Online access to WISDOM is available to any ALANET subscribers whose identification has been cleared by the Division. Currently, only public library systems have requested this access.

To avoid scheduling conflicts, planners of professional meetings are urged to post all of their organization's meetings on the bulletin board in the calendar category which lists meetings and continuing education programs in chronological order. To do so, contact your public library system with the following information: date and time of meeting; name of organization, division, section, etc. sponsoring or responsible for the meeting; specifics of meeting location; contact person's name and telephone number.
