NEW SEARCH FEATURES ON ELHILL

Some long awaited search capabilities have just been inaugurated on ELHILL, the system that is used for searching many of the MEDLARS data bases. If you have not read the full information on the NEWS feature of MEDLARS, now is the time to do that.

One of the most important enhancements is the new print feature which now allows a searcher to call directly for specific citations by their number in a print statement, separated by spaces or commas. e.g. prt or print 1, 4, 5-9. If you want to print only one citation you must precede the number with a dash e.g. prt -7, otherwise it will give print the first 7 citations. There is other helpful print command information which is included in the news command.

The neighbor or neighbordet (nbr or nbrdet) command has been restructured so that there is now a number by each displayed term. This list is now a select list from which terms may be directly chosen and incorporated into the search strategy through a new command called select. The news command again gives you full detail on how to use this feature.

The meeting was called to order by President Jackie Glick on Friday, October 15, 1987 at 1:30 pm at the Quality Inn South, Madison, WI.

The reading of the minutes from the April 29, 1987 WHSLA Executive Committee Meeting was dispensed with. The minutes were approved with one correction. Under the Election Committee section, "Area Representatives" should be changed to "Representatives at Large". A motion was made by Mary Kotschi and seconded by Kay Ciapl to approve the minutes as corrected.

Linda Oddan reported for Jan Curnes, Treasurer. WHSLA has a balance of \$4495.31 as of October 15, 1987.

Committee Reports

1987 WHSLA Annual Meeting Committee
Jackie Glick reported that there were 105 registrants for the 1987 annual meeting. Evaluations of the meeting were good. Approximately \$1200 profit was generated. A letter will be sent by the WHSLA secretary to SWHSL and MCH to thank them for their sponsorship of the meeting.

1988 WHSLA Annual Meeting Committee
Peg Allen reported that the 1988 annual meeting will be held in Eau Claire. The location is downtown. Plans will be made for a tenth birthday celebration. Al Zimmermann will write a history of WHSLA for the birthday celebration. The WHSLA board meeting will be held on Wednesday night. UW Eau Claire Library Science students who help with registration etc. will be allowed to attend Friday's meeting free. A correction was made to the call for papers announcement. It should read "April 28-29, 1988." Suggestions for papers were discussed. Four hundred flyers will be printed for the meeting.

1989 WHSLA Annual Meeting Committee
Tentative dates for the 1989 meeting are April 26-29 or April 19-22. These ideas were requested by Robert Koehler.

Continuing Education
Jackie Glick reported for Mary Blackwelder. It was moved by Mary Kotschi, seconded by Kay Ciapl, and unanimously passed that Mary Bayorgeon will be contacted regarding her willingness to pursue an appointment to COLAND. Jackie Glick will write to COLAND endorsing Mary's appointment.

Planning
Cindy Reinl suggested the formation of an ad hoc committee to study the possibility of merging CWHSLN and WHSLA. Peg Allen will survey GMRMLN reps to find possible models for a merger. An ad hoc committee was appointed to study the issue and give a report at the spring WHSLA meeting. Ad hoc committee members are: Peg Allen, Barb Schaeichen, Cindy Reinl, and all other members of the planning committee. A discussion of Linda Oddan's "Tiara Method" of compensation for officers was held. A member survey to assess needs is being considered to determine long range goals.

Online Users
Shirley Gronholm reported on future ETN programs.

By-laws and Guidelines
Susan Anderson suggested that all committee chairs report to the by-laws chair at the end of every year to update the by-laws or guidelines. A discussion of the new guideline which limits to 12 the number of candidates that may run for representative-at-large was held. Midge Vos felt this may not be easy to limit. This will be tried for this year. Joy Shong offered to maintain the membership list for the next year. She will be appointed to the membership committee. Jan Curnes will continue as treasurer until April. It was moved by Carolyn Barloga, seconded by Kay Cimpl and unanimously passed that the treasurer be appointed to the board upon appointment as treasurer. The by-laws will be revised. Jan Curnes will send a print out of the membership list to Joy Shong. Jackie Glick will send a list of officers to Joy Shong and Barb Schmiechen for inclusion with the membership list and the newsletter.

Old Business

1. A discussion of the final completion of the guidelines was held.
2. Linda Oddan moved, Pat Craven seconded, and it was unanimously approved to accept Barb Schmiechen's cost estimates for 1980 newsletters.

New Business

1. Pat Brennan suggested that WHSLA consider a combined meeting with MCMLA in Milwaukee in 1989. The 1989 meeting is currently planned for Madison. Jackie Glick will write a letter to give to Barb Schmiechen to take to MCMLA inviting them to meet in Milwaukee in 1989. Shirley Gronholm moved, Cindy Reini seconded and it was unanimously passed that WHSLA will offer to cohost MCMLA in Milwaukee in 1989.
2. ETN will include a very interesting report on clinical decision making research from a report that will be published in BMLA.
3. The board approved Jackie Glick's request that WHSLA pay for coffee and muffins provided for the October 15, 1987 board meeting.

The Fall meeting of the Council for Wisconsin Health Sciences Libraries Network met in conjunction with the WHSLA Board on October 15 in the morning. Some of the most important issues covered included-

- A report of the nominating committee indicating candidates for state representative and alternate to the GMRMLN Advisory Council, and member-at-large position.
- The review of the Wisconsin Biomedical Union List Committee work. There are now 69 members in the List, 60 copies both fiche and print were sold this year resulting in a healthier treasury than usual.
- Payment of \$500.00 to CHS Libraries for COWL loan.
- The announcement that Northern, West Central and Western Consortia have merged to create the Northwest Consortium. They will be holding annual meetings. Barb DeWeerd and Sister Louise Therese Lotze are co-chairing this consortium.
- The announcement the Wisconsin Preservation Program (WISPPR) has been established through COWL.
- A report of the attendance of Peg Allen and Al Zimmermann at the COLAND hearing on multi-type cooperation.
- Direction to Chair Peg Allen to write a letter of support to Governor Thompson for the appointment of Mary Bayorgeon to COLAND.
- The formation of a Committee to study Basic Health Sciences Libraries interlibrary loan charges. (See article elsewhere).
- The directive to each consortium to select 3 or 4 libraries to conduct a modified nominal group process to identify health care providers information seeking processes. Peg Allen will receive the responses. The deadline is March 1, 1988.
- The naming of Cynthia Reini, Chair of the WHSLA Planning Committee, as chair of a joint committee to study the feasibility of merging the WHSLA Board and the Council.
- The call for the next meeting on April 29 at 7:00am. in Eau Claire.
