RESOURCE IMPROVEMENT GRANT AWARDED

National Library of Medicine has announced the awarding of a Resource Improvement Grant to Columbia College of Nursing, Columbia Hospital, Milwaukee. Shirley Chan is the Librarian and Marian H. Snyder is the Dean of the College. The grant amount was \$3,746 for the upgrading of their collection. Congratulations are in order for their work in writing and receiving such a grant.

Libraries are reminded that the Resource Improvement Grants continue to be available to assist in print collection development and training money for a designated library manager/librarian. Packets for the grants are available through the GMRMLN Management Office in Chicago.

WISCONSIN VETERANS HOME RECEIVES GRANT

The Wisconsin Veterans Home has received a \$6,595 LSCA grant to offer microcomputer access in the Home's library. "Using a Microcomputer to Promote Vitality Among Older Adults" will be administered by Linda Fay, librarian at the Home.

Linda Fay and Jane Arps, authors of the application, expect the project to help residents with communication and to offer recreation and cognitive rehabilitation. Word processing programs will help Veterans Home members write letters, while computer games will help give them some fun and stimulation. Education software will help residents with dementia, Alzheimer's Disease, and brain damage. An added benefit will be the "positive image of older adults interacting with an up-to-date technology," Jane Arps wrote in a recent issue of the newsletter published by the Outagamie-Waupaca Library System.

HEALTH INSTRUMENTS FILE DATABASE

Many times the librarians at the Center for Health Sciences Library are asked for searches about measuring instruments, assessment tools, and other related information. BRS has just released a database called Health Instruments File Database (HIFF) produced at the University of Pittsburgh. The file contains citations to journal articles, monograph chapters and other documents from national and international surveys, patient evaluation instruments and related information in nursing and other health, and behavioral sciences disciplines. HIFF offers students, researchers, practitioners, educators, administrators and evaluators, online collective access to questionnaires, observation checklists and manuals, index measures, coding schemes, scenarios and vignettes, rating scales, projective techniques and tests published in English. It is updated quarterly and covers 1985 to date with selective retrospective coverage. It uses MeSH headings as well as PsychoInfo thesaurus headings.

THE CERTIFICATE OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The announcement for the spring curriculum leading to the Certificate of Professional Development is now available. This unique program sponsored by the School of Library & Information Studies, Continuing Education Services, University of Wisconsin-Madison has been given high ratings for its fine teaching staff from all over the country. LIBRARY ITEMS OF INTEREST

There are too few librarians, according to the 1988-89 Occupational Outlook Handbook published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The number of graduates of library master's programs at US universities has dropped from 6,370 in 1974 to 3,538 in 1986. Estimates for 1987 are for a national rise of 100 graduates. According to Margaret Myers, director of ALA's office of library personnel resources, 80 to 85% of public librarians and 60 to 65% of academic librarians are women. But librarianship, competing with better-paid careers open to women, is not a career that women turn to naturally anymore. There are shortages reported in technical services (especially cataloging), and for people with systems experience. ...Libraries are spending more than 65% of their material dollars on journals, yet less than 5% on the average to provide access to the contents of those journals, according to the Colorado Alliance of Research Libraries.
