UPDATE ON THE SERIALS LIST QUESTION

One of the biggest decisions which Wisconsin health sciences libraries have had to face in the last few years has been the problem of whether or not to convert the serials list. There has been much confusion statewide about this issue. At its upcoming fall meeting (to be held during MC/MLA), the Council will discuss the consequences of the alternatives and decide upon a course of action. The basic decision involves whether or not Wisconsin libraries should access the SERHOLD database via OCLC or should continue to use the current method of access via Louisville (aka the Kentucky list or through GMRMLN). Whereas this issue is especially important for libraries which are now (or will soon be) active on DOCLINE, all libraries which participate in the Wisconsin Biomedical Union List of Serials (WBULS) will be affected by the final decision. Libraries which do not have holdings in the WBULS should be aware of conditions which may impact on them specifically.

Everyone who submits holdings on the WBULS recently received a mailing from Joy Shong requesting input on the conversion question. Joy will be presenting the results of that survey at the next Council meeting. If you have not already responded to Joy, please do so, as it will give her the information which the Council needs in making its decision. Your response to Joy's mailing does not necessarily mean that all steps have been finalized. Joy has collected a tremendous amount of data from NLM, GMRMLN, OCLC, WILS, Louisville etc, in order to summarize an extremely complex set of variables. If you did not receive a survey from Joy, or have further questions, please contact her at (414)647-5156.

To date, two consortia have made final decisions regarding their holdings. SWHSL and South Central have voted to convert their holdings from Louisville to OCLC. Both consortia agreed and voted that all members of their consortia would participate in the conversion.

Consortia and/or libraries which have not yet decided on conversion should keep in mind the issues of access, cost, DOCLINE participation, the use of the final product (the serials list), and the overall impact on the State and Regional Holdings lists.

GMRMLN REPORT FROM THE STATE REP

The first 1989 meeting of the Regional Advisory Council took place on July 10-11, 1989 at the Library of the Health Sciences, University of Illinois at Chicago. Most of the two-day meeting was devoted to a discussion of the impact of the NLM's Outreach Panel Report—"Improving Health Professionals' Access to Information," adapted by the Board of Regents in May, 1989. The Council was divided into four focus groups: "Enhanced document delivery," "Evaluation and promotion of information technology and products for end users," "End user and library staff training," and "Identification of users and their needs, and resources for meeting the needs." Each group developed some 40-50 statements on how to facilitate the achievement of their focus topic. Then the groups selected the five most popular statements for each focus topic and these were amplified in a second working session. Presently, the GMRMLN Management Office is developing a final report of the session which will be available by the Fall, 1989.

With regards to DOCLINE: as of June 15, 1989, of the 177 health sciences libraries in Wisconsin, 77 are on SERHOLD, and of these 77, 51 are active users of DOCLINE (66%). The GMRMLN strongly encourages all libraries to join DOCLINE. In order to join DOCLINE, a library's collection must be in the National Library of Medicine's SERHOLD database.
